First class rail travel can be arranged within Switzerland, and rail travel to/from Switzerland can be upgraded or replaced with flights, depending on your itinerary and time constraints.

First class travel can be arranged within Switzerland, and rail travel to/from Switzerland can be upgraded or replaced with flights, depending on your itinerary and time constraints. You may also consider combining two of these holidays for a two-week stay, or appending a trip on one of the iconic rail journeys to the end of the holiday.

Spanning the most south-easterly point of Switzerland, the Bernina Express takes you south by train through the canton of Grisons into Italy, past glaciers, mountains, and marvels of railway engineering. Then, the Bernina Express coach takes you west past Lake Como and back into Switzerland to Lugano. After your arrival into Zurich, spend one night at your choice of Zurich hotel before catching a train south to St Moritz. Just outside the Parc Ela and at the foot of the Suvretta Mountain, St Moritz is a picturesque place to spend a night at any time of year. From St Moritz on your fourth day, your experience of the Bernina Express begins in earnest. In less than one day, travel through southern Switzerland into northern Italy, finally stopping in Lugano for the final two nights of your tour.

ABOUT THE BERNINA EXPRESS

Route length 7.15 hours and 268km from Chur to Lugano or vice versa; including 156km rail travel and an optional 112km by bus

Stops Chur, Tiefencastel, Davos, Filisur, Bergun, Samedan, St Moritz, Pontresina, Ospizio Bernina, Alp Grum, Poschiavo, Le Prese, Tirano, and Lugano

Facilities There is no dining car, but carriages do have panoramic windows

The Bernina Express carriages are perhaps the most distinctive of all the iconic rail journeys. The panoramic windows stretch up onto the roof to allow passengers to admire the view from the lakes and meadows to the highest peaks and glaciers. The track itself features many twists and turns, navigating 360 degree revolutions, tackling dramatic changes in altitudes, and disappearing into the formidable rock faces of mountains.

DATES

This rail holiday can be arranged throughout the year. Timings can vary depending on the month and day of the week. Day one: Arrive in Zurich

Begin this touring holiday with a flight or rail journey into Zurich. Though the flight will drastically cut travelling times, enabling an earlier arrival, we would always recommend taking the scenic railway trip via Paris, Dijon, and Basel, or via Brussels, Cologne, and Frankfurt. This is an excellent way of making the most of your journey, taking in a vast expanse of Western Europe as well as Switzerland upon your arrival.

Day two: Zurich to St Moritz

Board the train to St Moritz in the morning, arriving around 3 and a half hours later. This rail journey takes you first along the southern curve of Lake Zurich, passing through Horgen, Wadenswil, and heading inland onto the vast plains of the valley at Lachen. From here, you carry on towards the undulating green shores of Lake Walen, Weesen, and Walenstadt. Follow the paths of the valleys as you continue southeast to the spa town of Bad Ragaz, and cross the border into the canton of Grisons at Landquart. Change trains at Chur, Switzerland's oldest city, and join the pathway of the Bernina Express as it continues briefly west to Tamins, Rothenbrunnen, and Thusis. Notice the sheer white cliffs, hilltop towers, and gorges of the Ruinaulta as you traverse the area around the pretty ochre village of Tiefencastel. The train now sweeps back round to Filisur, passing through the railway town of Bergun, Samedan, Celerina, home to the Cresta Run, and finally arriving in St Moritz. You stay in St Moritz at your choice of elegant hotel. Use the rest of your afternoon to explore the quaint village of St Moritz.

Day three: St Moritz

The dry, clear climate of the Upper Engadine Valley makes St Moritz the perfect winter sports resort, but also well-suited to long rambles, walks, and hikes across the undulating mountainside. Perhaps spend an hour or two wandering around the lake shore, admiring the mountains and the waterside, and uncovering shady groves, trickling waterfalls, and hidden caves. It is also possible to navigate higher up the mountains by rail, reaching the vantage points on the Piz Corvatsch and Chantarella at the top of the steep track. At Corviglia, a cable car takes you up to the Suvretta Mountain's most popular viewing point. Those looking for more thrilling and active experiences could partake in the water sports at Lake St Moritz or Lake Sils, or across at the high-altitude Lake Silvaplana, known for being windy.

Day four: Lugano to Tirano on the Bernina Express

Board the Bernina Express mid-morning. In one of the distinctive red train carriages, with their tall, angular windows, and comfortable, airy interiors, the Bernina Express will take you from St Moritz to Tirano on the Swiss-Italian border. The Bernina Express takes you around the Montebello Curve, the most photographed section of the journey, which prolongs the breath-taking views of the Morteratsch Glacier. From here, gain altitude until you reach the highest point on the Rhaetian Railway at Ospizio Bernina at 2253m above sea level, with its picturesque, isolated station house. The Bernina Express then takes you to a restaurant that can only be accessed by train, past the grand houses of Poschiavo, through idyllic villages, across a spiralling viaduct, to Tirano, surrounded by vineyards and orchards in Italy. From here, disembark the train and board the dedicated Bernina Express bus which drives past mountain lakes, fertile green agricultural land, and ancient towns and villages to Lugano, the largest town in the Swiss region of Ticino. Stay at one of our luxury hotels in Lugano.

Day five: Lugano

Use your fifth day to explore this cultural lakeside town, which is quintessential of the Ticino region. Lugano's Old Town will be one of the highlights of your stay here, with its relaxed café culture influenced by both the Italian border and the prominent Swiss towns to the north. Pay a visit to the Cathedral of

Saint Lawrence, which sits at the top of the gently stepped Via Cattedrale. This Roman Catholic cathedral was founded in the Middle Ages, but was drastically rebuilt in the late 15th century. Its tower still rises high above Lugano, crowned by a distinctive green dome. For a further, more rounded, insight into Swiss cultural history, visit the waterside pink-fronted Museum of Cultures. Lake Lugano is perfect for a final sweeping boat trip, or for sampling the local water sports. The peak of nearby Monte Bre can be reached by funicular railway from Casserate, from where you can take in the sublime views, seek out the forested beauty spots, and embark on a hiking trail. San Salvatore can also be reached by funicular railway from Lugano, and offers an alternative, but no less stunning, perspective.

Day six: Return via Zurich

After two nights in Lugano, board the train back to Zurich for your return flight, or to Milan for a taste of cosmopolitan Italian life before flying back. If you wish to return by rail, we would recommend spending an extra night in Zurich beforehand.

OPTIONAL

It is possible to add extra nights in Zurich, St Moritz, and Lugano, or in one of our hotels situated on the shores of the Italian Lakes.

HOTELS

At Zurich, St Moritz, and Lugano, you can choose between a range of different luxury hotels, details of which can be found below.



ZURICH

Hotel du Theatre 3 star

This three star option in the centre of Zurich offers quirky and good-value accommodation in a hotel that adopts a cinema theme. Rooms are therefore suitably modern, with wholly unique features and excellent access to Lake Zurich and the city's important cultural sites.

Hotel Ambassador a l'Opera 4 star

As a member of the Small Luxury Hotels of the World group, the Hotel Ambassador a l'Opera prides itself on the high quality of its service, its seasonal and locally-sourced food, and the very particular, serene style of the rooms. It is well-placed for enjoying Lake Zurich, the Limmat River, and the small marina at the end of the street.

Hotel Storchen Zurich 5 star

Since the beginning of its hospitality 650 years ago, the unique and charming Hotel Storchen Zurich has offered an authentic insight into Swiss culture, design, and lifestyle. A pavement café lines the riverside, and behind the distinctive pink facade are high-ceilinged, tastefully decorated rooms, and the Rotisserie Restaurant, the ceiling of which is decorated in frescoes.

Hotel Baur au Lac 5 star

Set on the banks of Lake Zurich, the Hotel Baur au Lac is equipped with a Michelinstarred restaurant, extensive tranquil parkland, and a rich, warm interior design. Guests can enjoy the beauty of the lake from the promenade or from a boat cruise, before returning to the hotel to enjoy the serene gardens, the chic luxurious indoor spaces, and the circular restaurant that juts out across the water.

ST MORITZ

Hotel Hauser 3 star

This family run hotel is a hub of social activity in St Moritz, providing excellent food on a pretty outdoor terrace that caters for visitors and local residents alike. The guestrooms have a simple elegance, and are the perfect base from which to get out and explore St Moritz.

Hotel Schweizerhof St Moritz 4 star

Dating from over 100 years ago, the Hotel Schweizerhof St Moritz is a sophisticated hotel

built in the Belle Epoque style. Fresh, bright, and luxurious rooms are accompanied by multiple dining options, including a picturesque garden and a selection of relaxing spa facilities.

Giardino Mountain Champfer 5 star superior

This chic, luxury hotel is a gem amongst the Engadine hotels. Traditional alpine style architecture is balanced with stylish accommodation, authentic and modern dining, an indulgent spa and a fantastic central location for summer sports as well as laidback relaxation. The Giardino Mountain closes for several months between the main winter and summer seasons.

Kempinski Grand Hotel Des Bains 5 star

The first hotel to be built in St Moritz, the Grand Hotel des Bains was constructed in 1864 at the source of the Mauritius springs. This grand spa hotel offers traditional elegance with an Italian palazzo-style design in a breath-taking Alpine location. Make the most of excellent spa facilities, a range of dining options and golf and tennis facilities.

LUGANO

Hotel Lugano Dante 4 star

Built around traditional Swiss elements, this hotel provides simplistic luxuries in an area rich with gourmet restaurants. Inside the hotel, guests experience cosy, warm rooms, sleek, monochrome suites, and an unrelenting attention to detail.

Grand Hotel Villa Castagnola 5 star

Housed within a late 19th century mansion, the Grand Hotel Villa Castagnola channels aspects of Mediterranean culture in its palepeach façade, its summery garden, and the dining experiences on offer. Guestrooms have wholly unique touches to ensure that every stay here is different, and the swimming pool, lounges, and bars encourage guests to keep returning.



GENERAL INFORMATION

This rail holiday is one of several suggested rail holidays we can offer you exactly as it is but also with any alterations you might want including extra nights in one or more places or adding in extra places. All our tours can be extended so that you can include a longer stay in one mountain or lake resort too, perhaps at the end of the itinerary. Do call to discuss the options with our travel consultants.



OUR TOURS

Our rail tours are for individuals travelling on their own or in their own family group. You do not join a group and you are not escorted.

FLEXIBLE ARRANGEMENTS

Our arrangements are very flexible in that you choose to travel on any day you want, subject to availability of trains and hotels. As mentioned above, additional nights can be added at any point.

FLEX PASS INCLUDED

We include travel to and from your first and last hotel but also a Flex pass is included for the rest of the holiday, depending on its length. For example, on a long stay we would include an 8 day Flex pass. This gives you 8 non-consecutive but selected days of travel within a one-month period.

The pass gives you a choice that includes

- Unlimited travel by rail, road and waterway on your selected days of validity, including most panorama routes and public transport in 75 towns and cities
- Free admission to more than 490 museums on the selected days of validity
- Children under the age of 16 travel free of charge when accompanied by at least one parent holding the Swiss Family Card

If we have included a panoramic route in your holiday, we will automatically include any applicable supplements for that train.

TRAIN TIMES

We have planned our itineraries based on train times that work day by day at the time of planning which can be up to a year before you travel. Usually train times stay more or less the same every day, season by season. The times we have planned will be discussed with you at the time you enquire about the holiday and they are detailed to you in your written holiday quotation. It may be that the timetable changes between the planning of the itinerary and when you come to book but we can always adjust the itinerary to suit the actual train times and any requirements you have for particular times of travel.

FIRST OR SECOND CLASS

We will automatically include travel in second class but lots of our clients do upgrade to first class service. On Eurostar this is called Premier Standard for leisure travellers as it gives you an upgraded on-board service and more spacious seating but without paying for the fully-flexible business tickets. On the TGV trains from France to Switzerland, upgrading to first class gives you more spacious seating with increased legroom. Within Switzerland, first class gives you again more space and more comfortable seats, often with a quieter environment. The price of upgrading varies from route to route but is something that is not always proportionately a lot more on the price of the overall holiday, so well-worth considering.

LUGGAGE TRANSFER SERVICE

Swiss rail operates an efficient transfer service for your luggage. This works in a number of ways:

For travel to Switzerland by air, you can checkin your baggage with any airline, from any airport in the world and it will be forwarded to our destination station in Switzerland from Zurich, Bern or Geneva airports. Simply collect your baggage from the station at your destination.

Swiss, you can check-in for your flight at the train station the day before you fly (major stations only). You receive your boarding pass and your seat allocation and your baggage will be transported onto the aircraft.

For departure from Switzerland with other airlines eg British Airways or Easyjet, you can have your baggage transported to the airport train station in Zurich or Genevia and you

For departure from Switzerland if flying with

have your baggage transported to the airport train station ie Zurich or Geneva and you collect it from there to take it to check-in as usual. Just allow enough time for the luggage to reach the airport station, so well before you travel. Your station will be able to advise a day or two beforehand.

Within Switzerland you can transfer your luggage from one location to another. The Fast Baggage service is available between 45 destinations. You just have to check-in your luggage before 9am at your departure station and collect it by 6pm on the same day at your destination (or sometimes the following day, depending on the actual destination). The cost of this service is approximately £17 per item.

TRANSFERS

Transfers in Paris between stations and from the station to each hotel are not automatically included in the price of the holiday. In Paris most clients choose to take a taxi between the stations rather than go on the Metro but we can arrange a private car with driver to take you in between. This is quite useful if you are a family group that can't fit into one Paris taxi. In Switzerland, depending on the location, hotels sometimes have their own transfer vehicles that they will send to collect you if we advise them in advance (eg in St Moritz and Zermatt this is usual) but elsewhere some hotels are within walking distance and others are a short taxi ride away.



OUR PRICES

The sample prices mentioned in this leaflet are generally a 'from' price based on the cheapest season of travel. However, train fares and hotel rates can change (up and down depending on offers), so we give you an accurate price for your holiday when we provide you with a quotation. Our sample prices should be used as an indication of how much a particular combination will cost and to show the differences on average between the hotel categories on offer.

Glacier Express

Begin this Glacier Express touring holiday by either flying into Geneva, or arriving via train. Then, continue to Zermatt, a picturesque, traffic-free town overlooked by the Gornergrat, the Hornli Ridge, and the Matterhorn. After three nights, board the Glacier Express and hurtle on through enchanting villages punctuated by Alpine chalets which emerge from clusters of green forest. Pass the emblematic castle of Upper Valais, head through the Furka tunnel to Oberwald, traverse the Gotthard Pass, see the Ruinaulta, cast a sweeping gaze over Switzerland's oldest town, and journey through the Albula tunnel, rising and falling with the varied lie of the land, passing glaciers and surreal mountain peaks, until you reach St Moritz. Your return journey takes you via Zurich where, if returning by train, you may wish to stay for an extra night.

ABOUT THE GLACIER EXPRESS

Route length 8 hours, over 291km, from Zermatt to St Moritz

Stops Zermatt, St Niklaus, Brig, Fiesch, Andermatt, Disentis, Chur, Thusis, Tiefencastel, Davos, Filisur, Bergun, Samedan, Celerina, St Moritz

Facilities On-board restaurant and waiter service, and panoramic carriages

Each distinctive carriage has wide panoramic windows to ensure that guests can fully appreciate the views. 2nd Class carriages are organised with bays of four seats situated around tables on each side of the aisle, while 1st Class carriages have bays of four on one side and two on the other, both with tables. 1st Class offers a quieter travel experience and more space. As an alternative to the onboard restaurant, orders are taken from seats for snacks, drinks, and lunch items throughout the journey, with a wide selection of wines.

Day one: Geneva to Zermatt

Begin this Glacier Express holiday by travelling to Geneva, either by plane or train. From here, board the train to Zermatt in the early afternoon. Change trains at Visp, and arrive into Zermatt around four hours after departure from Geneva. Your hotel in Zermatt will send a complimentary shuttle to collect you from the station.

Days two and three: Zermatt

In an idyllic, car-free zone, known for its popular winter sports, Zermatt is a stunning place to start this memorable trip. A peaceful village in the summer months, Zermatt is a haven for gourmet food lovers, with the highest concentration of gourmet restaurants, serving very typically Swiss cuisine, on the Glacier Express route. Quaint boutique shops are also housed within the chalet houses in the village centre. Take in the views of the icy Matterhorn, and wander along some of the 400km of walking paths that vein the landscape around Zermatt, Tasch, and Randa. Perhaps even enjoy the sights from the smaller railways that can take you as high as 3000m above sea level. The Glacier Paradise cable car will take you up to Europe's highest viewing platform, while the Gornegratbahn, the world's highest open-air cog railway, takes you from Zermatt station up to the Gornergrat where you can view the peaks of 38 surrounding mountains, including the Matterhorn. Consider visiting the famous Hornlihutte, where climbers have stayed for decades before advancing up the sides of the Matterhorn via the Hornli Ridge, the Zmutt Ridge, or through the north wall. To witness more of the sublime and intriguing history of the area, visit the Zermatlantis Matterhorn Museum, an archaeological site that has been faithfully recreated.

Day four: Zermatt to St Moritz

After your final night in Zermatt, catch the Glacier Express to St Moritz at around 9 in the morning, with a view to arrive at around 5pm. Some highlights of this route include the phenomenal Stockalper Castle, the icy walls near the Rhone Glacier, the harsh landscape of the Gotthard Pass, the complex network of tunnels, viaducts, and railway tracks of the Oberalp Pass, the winding Rhine River, the panoramas across Chur, the castles and palaces of the Domleschg Region, the curved Landwasser viaduct, and the Cresta Run, just outside St Moritz. Transfers can be arranged from St Moritz station to your hotel.

Day five: St Moritz

At 1856m above sea level, visitors are welcomed by stunning views across the lakes of the Upper Engadine Valley, and the refreshing dry, clear, Alpine climate. Navigate the local peaks via railway, reaching the Piz Corvatsch, Chantarella, and Corviglia, where a cable car takes you up to Suvretta's most famous viewing point. Enjoy the water sports at the sublime Lake Sils and Lake St Moritz, or the windy Lake Silvaplana. While staying in St Moritz, it is possible to use this opportunity to explore another of Switzerland's most iconic rail journeys, the Bernina Express. In one of the distinctive red trains, with their tall, angular windows, and comfortable, airy interiors, the Bernina Express rail journey takes you from Chur, the oldest city in Switzerland, south through the winter resorts of Davos and St Moritz to Tirano on the Swiss-Italian border. En-route you pass the dramatic Ruinaulta, or Rhine Gorge, the castles and palaces of the Domleschg Region, and the Morteratsch Glacier, and travel over the Landwasser Viaduct and around the Montebello Curve.

Day six: Return via Zurich

If you depart for Zurich in the mid-morning, you will arrive at around half one in the afternoon, which leaves plenty of time to enjoy a few hours in the city before catching a flight home. If you are catching a train from Zurich back to London, we would recommend spending the night in Zurich before your departure.



DAY-BY-DAY ITINERARY

Geneva - Lausanne - Montreux - GoldenPass Line - Gstaad - Simmental - Zurich



Day one: Geneva to Lausanne

Begin your GoldenPass touring holiday by arriving into Geneva, either by air or via Paris by rail. Take an hour or so to explore the old town of this beautiful city and to see the Jet d'Eau erupting out of the waters of Lake Geneva. Finally, pass the delightful chic resort of Gstaad, before reaching Schoenried, at around 13:14, where you will spend the next three nights. Days three and four: Saanenland

Explore the Alpine meadows on foot, trail the hiking paths across the slopes, and seek out the hidden waterfalls and streams that vein the landscape. From Schoenried, you can enjoy all this, and more, in one sweeping glance. Visit the glacier at Les Diablerets, and take the cable car up to the Rellerli or the chairlift up to the Horneggli for a long, satisfying walk. In Gstaad, make the most of the menagerie of unique boutique shops and try out many of the gourmet restaurants, styled on the traditional Swiss chalets.



Wilhelm Tell, the Swiss National Hero of Liberty, is one of the best known folk characters in Switzerland. Friedrich von Schiller penned the most popular recounting of Tell's fable in his poem, which is still performed in Switzerland more than 200 years later. Begin your touring holiday with a three-night stay in Lucerne, the City of Lights, before boarding the Gotthard Panorama Express on your fourth day. The route of the Gotthard Panorama Express takes you first zig-zagging across Lake Lucerne in your choice of a steamboat or salon motorboat. Pass the iconic locations mentioned in Schiller's poem, including the Rutli Meadows and Tell's Chapel at Sisikon. When you reach Fluelen on the southern-most shore of the lake, disembark and board the train heading to Locarno. The journey south towards the Italian border is lined with snow-capped peaks, interspersed with dramatic valleys, and broken up by a number of historic, picturesque towns. When you reach Bellinzona, change trains for Lugano, where you will spend two nights before heading into Italy for a return flight from Milan, or back north to Zurich for a return flight or train.

DAY-BY-DAY ITINERARY

Lucerne - Gotthard Panorama Express - Gotthard - Bellinzona - Lugano



Day one: Arrive in Zurich and travel to Lucerne

On your first day, fly or catch a train via Paris into Zurich. If time allows, perhaps spend an hour taking in this historic and enchanting city, stopping at the Grossmunster church and climbing the Karlstrum tower. Then board the train and take the short journey south to Lucerne, where you will spend the first part of your rail holiday.

Days two and three: Lucerne

The so-called City of Light is a bubble of cosmopolitan atmosphere, as well as a place of rich, historic significance. Wander down the pretty streets, taking in the individuality of the boutique shops and quaint cafes, or venture out into the surrounding landscape, visiting the Titlis Glacier, the Alpine meadows, and appreciating the views over the 13 nearby lakes, Swiss Mittelland, and the German and French borders from the Rigi Mountain. The Pilatus Mountain affords climbers and hikers views across more than 70 Alpine peaks, and is steeped in legends of dragons, giants, and royal graveyards. Two cog railways, from Vitznau and Goldau, and a panoramic cable car trip from Weggis offer relaxing ways to take in the scenery. A highlight of your stay in Lucerne will be walking along the Chapel Bridge and seeing the Water Tower, though the river itself has much more to offer. We would encourage using your time in Lucerne as an opportunity to visit many more of the towns and villages on the northern shore of the lake.

Day four: Lucerne to Lugano on the Gotthard Panorama Express

Heading south from Lucerne, board the Gotthard Panorama steamboat or salon motorboat from the Swiss Museum of Transport's lido. This boat trip takes you across Lake Lucerne, from Lucerne to Fluelen, passing the notable points of interest from Schiller's poem about Wilhelm Tell. Pass the picturesque white villages of Weggis and Vitznau, the bustling town of Brunnen, the Rutli Meadows, and Tell's Chapel in Sisikon, where he reputedly jumped from the bailiff's boat before pushing it back into the storm. Presiding over all of this is the imposing Rigi Mountain. When you reach Fluelen, disembark and board the Gotthard Panorama Express train, which is headed towards Locarno. Follow the pathway of the Reuss River as it slices through wide, flat valleys further inland, before the railway gains altitude as the valleys narrow. Chocolate box villages dot the hillsides, and the railway tracks navigate tunnels and steep curves, such as the Gotthard loop tunnels and the Gotthard

Strassentunnel, as you head further south into Ticino. Waterfalls, twisting streams, and historic chalets steam past the window as you go. An Italianate influence becomes apparent as you reach mid-south Ticino, particularly in Bellinzona, where you will change trains for Lugano. Take in the sight of the two opposing medieval castles, perched on their small hilltops, before continuing south. The landscape here is a patchwork of agricultural fields, with Monte Tamaro erupting out of the smooth land to separate Lake Maggiore from Lugano. Once you arrive in Lugano, disembark for a two night stay at your choice of luxury hotel.

Day five: Lugano

Use your time in Lugano to explore this cultural lakeside town, which is quintessential of the Ticino region. Lugano's Old Town will be one of the highlights of your stay here, with its relaxed café culture influenced by both the Italian border and the prominent Swiss towns to the north. Pay a visit to the Cathedral of Saint Lawrence, which sits at the top of the gently stepped Via Cattedrale. This Roman Catholic cathedral was founded in the Middle Ages, but was drastically rebuilt in the late 15th century. Its tower still rises high above Lugano, crowned by a distinctive green dome. For a further, more rounded, insight into Swiss cultural history, visit the waterside pink-fronted Museum of Cultures. Lake Lugano is perfect for a final sweeping boat trip, or for sampling the local water sports. The peak of nearby Monte Bre can be reached by funicular railway from Casserate, from where you can take

in the sublime views, seek out the forested beauty spots, and embark on a hiking trail. San Salvatore can also be reached by funicular railway from Lugano, and offers an alternative, but no less stunning, perspective.

Day six: Travel home

On your final day in Switzerland, you can choose to either continue south into Italy to catch a return flight from Milan or to catch a train north to Zurich, via Bern, for a return rail journey. If you decide on a return journey via rail from Zurich, we would recommend spending one extra night here before departure.

OPTIONAL

It is possible to add extra nights in Zurich, Lucerne, Lugano, Geneva, or Bern.

Hotel Schweizerhof Luzern 5 star

This luxury hotel enjoys a central location on the lakefront close to the historic Old Town. The Schweizerhof has seen many a famous face stay here and is now run by the fifth generation of the family. The hotel offers a wellness and beauty area with stunning views of the lake as well as two on-site restaurants.



GENERAL INFORMATION

This rail holiday is one of several suggested rail holidays we can offer you exactly as it is but also with any alterations you might want including extra nights in one or more places or adding in extra places. All our tours can be extended so that you can include a longer stay in one mountain or lake resort too, perhaps at the end of the itinerary. Do call to discuss the options with our travel consultants.



OUR TOURS

Our rail tours are for individuals travelling on their own or in their own family group. You do not join a group and you are not escorted.

FLEXIBLE ARRANGEMENTS

Our arrangements are very flexible in that you choose to travel on any day you want, subject to availability of trains and hotels. As mentioned above, additional nights can be added at any point.

FLEX PASS INCLUDED

We include travel to and from your first and last hotel but also a Flex pass is included for the rest of the holiday, depending on its length. For example, on a long stay we would include an 8 day Flex pass. This gives you 8 non-consecutive but selected days of travel within a one-month period.

The pass gives you a choice that includes

- Unlimited travel by rail, road and waterway on your selected days of validity, including most panorama routes and public transport in 75 towns and cities
- Free admission to more than 490 museums on the selected days of validity
- Children under the age of 16 travel free of charge when accompanied by at least one parent holding the Swiss Family Card

If we have included a panoramic route in your holiday, we will automatically include any applicable supplements for that train.

TRAIN TIMES

We have planned our itineraries based on train times that work day by day at the time of planning which can be up to a year before you travel. Usually train times stay more or less the same every day, season by season. The times we have planned will be discussed with you at the time you enquire about the holiday and they are detailed to you in your written holiday quotation. It may be that the timetable changes between the planning of the itinerary and when you come to book but we can always adjust the itinerary to suit the actual train times and any requirements you have for particular times of travel.

FIRST OR SECOND CLASS

We will automatically include travel in second class but lots of our clients do upgrade to first class service. On Eurostar this is called Premier Standard for leisure travellers as it gives you an upgraded on-board service and more spacious seating but without paying for the fully-flexible business tickets. On the TGV trains from France to Switzerland, upgrading to first class gives you more spacious seating with increased legroom. Within Switzerland, first class gives you again more space and more comfortable seats, often with a quieter environment. The price of upgrading varies from route to route but is something that is not always proportionately a lot more on the price of the overall holiday, so well-worth considering.

LUGGAGE TRANSFER SERVICE

Swiss rail operates an efficient transfer service for your luggage. This works in a number of ways:

For travel to Switzerland by air, you can checkin your baggage with any airline, from any airport in the world and it will be forwarded to our destination station in Switzerland from Zurich, Bern or Geneva airports. Simply collect your baggage from the station at your destination.

Swiss, you can check-in for your flight at the train station the day before you fly (major stations only). You receive your boarding pass and your seat allocation and your baggage will be transported onto the aircraft.

For departure from Switzerland with other airlines eg British Airways or Easyjet, you can

For departure from Switzerland if flying with

airlines eg British Airways or Easyjet, you can have your baggage transported to the airport train station ie Zurich or Geneva and you collect it from there to take it to check-in as usual. Just allow enough time for the luggage to reach the airport station, so well before you travel. Your station will be able to advise a day or two beforehand.

Within Switzerland you can transfer your luggage from one location to another. The Fast Baggage service is available between 45 destinations. You just have to check-in your luggage before 9am at your departure station and collect it by 6pm on the same day at your destination (or sometimes the following day, depending on the actual destination). The cost of this service is approximately £17 per item.

TRANSFERS

Transfers in Paris between stations and from the station to each hotel are not automatically included in the price of the holiday. In Paris most clients choose to take a taxi between the stations rather than go on the Metro but we can arrange a private car with driver to take you in between. This is quite useful if you are a family group that can't fit into one Paris taxi. In Switzerland, depending on the location, hotels sometimes have their own transfer vehicles that they will send to collect you if we advise them in advance (eg in St Moritz and Zermatt this is usual) but elsewhere some hotels are within walking distance and others are a short taxi ride away.

DAY-BY-DAY ITINERARY

Zurich - Locarno - Centovalli Express - Bern



Day one: Arrive in Zurich

Fly into Zurich on your first day, arriving early afternoon, or journey from London by train, arriving in the late afternoon. If time permits, spend a few hours exploring the city. Make sure you have time to visit the Grossmunster Church, perhaps climbing the Karlstrum, one of the church's two iconic towers. Enjoy the pretty streets, cafes, and boutiques of Zurich's old town, and have dinner either at your luxury hotel or in one of the many high-class gourmet restaurants in this area.

Day two: Zurich to Locarno

Say goodbye to Zurich and board a train south to Locarno in the province of Ticino. This journey will take approximately three hours, ideally arriving mid-afternoon. Once in Locarno, stay at your luxury hotel, using the time to explore the Swiss side of Lake Maggiore and the romantic rolling plains of Ticino.

Days three and four: Locarno

Locarno is known for having the warmest climate in Switzerland, which propagates a very Mediterranean feel, particularly amongst the palm trees and sand on the lake banks. For a taste of the city's religious heritage, visit one of the many idyllic churches, including the 17th century Church of St Anthony, the 16th century Church of San Francesco, the mid-17th century New Church, and the late 15th century Sanctuary of the Madonna del Sasso, all of which are dotted around the historic streets. Your priority within Locarno is likely to be the brooding Visconti Castle, in which there is a permanent Roman glass exhibition. On one of your days here, venture outside Locarno to see the turquoise, clear waters of the rivers and streams around the lake, to relax on a lake cruise, or to climb up to the Cadada Cimetta, from where you can see both the highest and lowest parts of Switzerland in one glance: the Valais High Alps and Lake Maggiore.

Day five: Locarno to Bern via the Centovalli Express

In the late morning of your last day in Locarno, board the Centovalli Express to Domodossola; a journey that takes around two hours. You will begin by travelling north into the Maggia Valley, where the Ponte Brolla crosses the turbulent river. Rocks smoothed by centuries of rushing water prove popular with cliff divers, and tunnels and caves offer much in the way of exploration. Grottos hide beneath the rock surface. At the prehistoric ruins of Tegna, the Centovalli Express turns west, passing shallow river beaches, traditional Ticino villages of ramshackle roofs and bright plastered walls,

and imposing hilltop churches. At Cavigliano, the valley opens out; the ground quilted by geometric agricultural fields. Cross a Romanstyle bridge and head towards the iron bridges of Intragna, the sparsely populated villages that follow, and Monte Camino and the isolated hamlet of Rasa. The Centovalli Express now crosses the Italian border just before pulling into secluded Ribellasca and Re, home to the impressive and startling Sanctuary of the Madonna of the Blood, which definitely warrants a brief stop for a tour. Pass through more quaint villages on your way to the truly unique Santa Maria Maggiore. Here, the valley becomes narrower and dense with vegetation and forest. A series of small settlements nestle between the steep slopes, seemingly cut off from the larger villages at either end of the valley. In Trontano, the Swiss influence is still visible in the architecture, but it peters out as you pass through Creggio and Masera, and finally arrive in Domodossola. You may like to spend a few hours enjoying the sight of the tall townhouses crowded around the vast squares, and have lunch in a pavement café. Visit the Sacro Monte del Calvario, built by Capuchin Monks, the 14th century Palazzo Silva, and the medieval Motta district. Then, when your exploration is complete, board another train to Brig. This fairly direct route takes less than half an hour and makes very few stops, giving you time to sit back and fully enjoy the views across the mountains and valleys without interruption. Once in Brig, you have the option to take a self-guided tour around the cobbled streets,

stopping at the Stockalper Castle, which is undoubtedly the town's most impressive monument. Your train will then take you north to Bern, the Swiss capital, where you will be staying.

Day six: Return via Zurich

Bern is tucked away on a meander of the Aare River and home to a beautiful Old Town that is continually popular with artists and writers. Over 100 fountains are dotted around the city, some dating back to the Middle Ages, and some topped with folkloric figures. Key cultural sites in Bern include the House of Parliament, topped by an iconic copper-clad dome, Bern Cathedral, the largest ecclesiastical building in Switzerland, the Bernisches Historisches Museum, housing an Einstein exhibit and several Burgundy tapestries, and the astronomical Zytglogge Clock Tower, with its revolving faces and unique hands. Perhaps extend your stay here to ensure you have time to explore the whole city; otherwise, continue on to Zurich for your return flight to the UK. You may choose to travel home by train, in which case we would recommend spending an extra night in Zurich.

OPTIONAL

It is possible to add extra nights in Zurich, Locarno, or Bern. Consider also adding an extra night in Brig on day 5, or extending the holiday in Zermatt before travelling home via air or rail from Geneva.

This three star option in the centre of Zurich offers quirky and good-value accommodation in a hotel that adopts a cinema theme. Rooms are therefore suitably modern, with wholly unique features and excellent access to Lake Zurich and the city's important cultural sites.

Hotel Ambassador a l'Opera 4 star

As a member of the Small Luxury Hotels of the World group, the Hotel Ambassador a l'Opera prides itself on the high quality of its service, its seasonal and locally-sourced food, and the very particular, serene style of the rooms. It is well-placed for enjoying Lake Zurich, the Limmat River, and the small marina at the end of the street.

Hotel Storchen Zurich 5 star

Since the beginning of its hospitality 650 years ago, the unique and charming Hotel Storchen Zurich has offered an authentic insight into Swiss culture, design, and lifestyle. A pavement café lines the riverside, and behind the distinctive pink façade are high-ceilinged, tastefully decorated rooms, and the Rotisserie Restaurant, the ceiling of which is decorated in frescoes.

Hotel Baur au Lac 5 star

Set on the banks of Lake Zurich, the Hotel Baur au Lac is equipped with a Michelinstarred restaurant, extensive tranquil parkland, and a rich, warm interior design. Guests can enjoy the beauty of the lake from the promenade or from a boat cruise, before returning to the hotel to enjoy the serene gardens, the chic luxurious indoor spaces, and the circular restaurant that juts out across the water.

ASCONA

Hotel Castello Seeschloss Ascona 4 star



GENERAL INFORMATION

This rail holiday is one of several suggested rail holidays we can offer you exactly as it is but also with any alterations you might want including extra nights in one or more places or adding in extra places. All our tours can be extended so that you can include a longer stay in one mountain or lake resort too, perhaps at the end of the itinerary. Do call to discuss the options with our travel consultants.



OUR TOURS

Our rail tours are for individuals travelling on their own or in their own family group. You do not join a group and you are not escorted.

FLEXIBLE ARRANGEMENTS

Our arrangements are very flexible in that you choose to travel on any day you want, subject to availability of trains and hotels. As mentioned above, additional nights can be added at any point.

FLEX PASS INCLUDED

We include travel to and from your first and last hotel but also a Flex pass is included for the rest of the holiday, depending on its length. For example, on a long stay we would include an 8 day Flex pass. This gives you 8 non-consecutive but selected days of travel within a one-month period.

The pass gives you a choice that includes

- Unlimited travel by rail, road and waterway on your selected days of validity, including most panorama routes and public transport in 75 towns and cities
- Free admission to more than 490 museums on the selected days of validity
- Children under the age of 16 travel free of charge when accompanied by at least one parent holding the Swiss Family Card

If we have included a panoramic route in your holiday, we will automatically include any applicable supplements for that train.

TRAIN TIMES

We have planned our itineraries based on train times that work day by day at the time of planning which can be up to a year before you travel. Usually train times stay more or less the same every day, season by season. The times we have planned will be discussed with you at the time you enquire about the holiday and they are detailed to you in your written holiday quotation. It may be that the timetable changes between the planning of the itinerary and when you come to book but we can always adjust the itinerary to suit the actual train times and any requirements you have for particular times of travel.

FIRST OR SECOND CLASS

We will automatically include travel in second class but lots of our clients do upgrade to first class service. On Eurostar this is called Premier Standard for leisure travellers as it gives you an upgraded on-board service and more spacious seating but without paying for the fully-flexible business tickets. On the TGV trains from France to Switzerland, upgrading to first class gives you more spacious seating with increased legroom. Within Switzerland, first class gives you again more space and more comfortable seats, often with a quieter environment. The price of upgrading varies from route to route but is something that is not always proportionately a lot more on the price of the overall holiday, so well-worth considering.

LUGGAGE TRANSFER SERVICE

Swiss rail operates an efficient transfer service for your luggage. This works in a number of ways:

For travel to Switzerland by air, you can checkin your baggage with any airline, from any airport in the world and it will be forwarded to our destination station in Switzerland from Zurich, Bern or Geneva airports. Simply collect your baggage from the station at your destination.

For departure from Switzerland if flying with Swiss, you can check-in for your flight at the train station the day before you fly (major stations only). You receive your boarding pass and your seat allocation and your baggage will be transported onto the aircraft.

For departure from Switzerland with other airlings and British Airways or Fasyiet, you can

airlines eg British Airways or Easyjet, you can have your baggage transported to the airport train station ie Zurich or Geneva and you collect it from there to take it to check-in as usual. Just allow enough time for the luggage to reach the airport station, so well before you travel. Your station will be able to advise a day or two beforehand.

Within Switzerland you can transfer your luggage from one location to another. The Fast Baggage service is available between 45 destinations. You just have to check-in your luggage before 9am at your departure station and collect it by 6pm on the same day at your destination (or sometimes the following day, depending on the actual destination). The cost of this service is approximately £17 per item. TRANSFERS

Transfers in Paris between stations and from the station to each hotel are not automatically included in the price of the holiday. In Paris most clients choose to take a taxi between the stations rather than go on the Metro but we can arrange a private car with driver to take you in between. This is quite useful if you are a family group that can't fit into one Paris taxi. In Switzerland, depending on the location, hotels sometimes have their own transfer vehicles that they will send to collect you if we advise them in advance (eg in St Moritz and Zermatt this is usual) but elsewhere some hotels are within walking distance and others are a short taxi ride away.

However, train fares and hotel rates can change (up and down depending on offers), so we give you an accurate price for your holiday when we provide you with a quotation. This grand tour of Switzerland encompasses all the highlights of this diverse country. Travel past stunning mountainscapes, sublime lakes, and creaking glaciers on iconic railway lines; stop off in unique, enchanting lakeside cities; and spend cosy evenings in quaint, chocolate-box villages beneath imposing mountains such as the Matterhorn.

This grand tour of Switzerland begins with your arrival into Geneva, by rail or by air. From here, you catch a train along the northern shore of Lake Geneva to Lausanne. Spend your time here exploring the other towns and villages on the lakeside, and perhaps taking a relaxed boat cruise. Then, move on into Valais for time in Zermatt, changing trains at Visp. This is the perfect opportunity to learn more about the Matterhorn, and to ascend to the summit of the Gornergrat by the funicular railway. From Zermatt, board the Glacier Express first thing in the morning and spend your day travelling to St Moritz, to arrive in the early evening. Stay in St Moritz, visiting the local lakes and reaching the neighbouring mountain peaks by cable car. Travel next from St Moritz south to Tirano on the Bernina Express line, where you disembark and board the dedicated Bernina Express coach for the remainder of the scenic journey by road to Lugano. Enjoy the Mediterranean feel of the Lugano and then head back north to Lucerne on the Gotthard Panorama Express route, first taking a train through Ticino and up to Fluelen, and then changing to a steamboat or salon motorboat. Stay in Lucerne, appreciating monuments such as the Water Tower and Chapel Bridge, before continuing on into the Bernese Oberland. Change trains in Interlaken for the peaceful chocolate-box villages of Grindelwald and Wengen. Leaving

Grindelwald at around lunchtime, take the short journey back down to Interlaken, for a train to Zweisimmen. Here, you join the GoldenPass Line to the Saanenland. Spend time here, enjoying Gstaad's exclusive central promenade, the stunning views across the wide Saanenland valley from the 'sun terrace' of Schoenried, and sampling some alpine specialities. Then, re-join the GoldenPass Line for the short journey to Montreux, the highlights of which are the views as you zigzag down the mountainside to the lake. From Montreux, visit such historic sites as Chillon Castle and the Lavaux Terraced Vineyards, before heading back to Geneva your return flight. If you wish to return by rail, we would recommend adding another night in Geneva before departure.

Day one: Arrive Geneva and train to Lausanne

Travel by rail or by air from London to Geneva on your first day. Perhaps spend an hour or two exploring the city, home to fine watch-making, the headquarters of the UN, and the Jet d'Eau fountain. Wander around the Vielle-Villa, the largest Old Town in Switzerland, stopping at the St Pierre Cathedral. From Geneva, catch a train along the northern shore of the lake to Lausanne. During your time in Lausanne, choose from its many elegant attractions; seek out the impressive historic monuments as well as the new, modern additions. Lausanne Cathedral is believed to be one of Europe's most beautiful Gothic monuments, crowned by spires of unusual purple and orange hues. A brand new Olympic Museum has recently opened in the heart of Lausanne's Old Town; three levels depict Olympic history in all its colourful grandeur. The placement of this new museum comes as a result of the Olympic Committee Headquarters being in Lausanne. The Olympic Park is adjoined to the museum, and is dotted with artworks, sports sculptures, and well-maintained flowers and trees. Beside the Olympic Park is the promenade at Ouchy Harbour, which, when lit up in the evening, will be one of the highlights of your trip. The promenade takes you from the gardens along to the Haldimand Tower, the Bellerive Swimming Pool, the Chateau d'Ouchy, and the port. Enjoy dinner in this beautiful area before returning to your hotel.

Day two: Lausanne to Zermatt

Today you travel by train from Lausanne to Zermatt. This train journey takes just shy of three hours, passing the 80 hectares of the stunning Lavaux Terraced Vineyards, Montreux and Chillon Castle, Martigny, and pausing at Visp while you change trains. As you enter Zermatt, the area's crowning glory will make itself apparent: the Matterhorn. Around it, over 400km of walking and hiking paths vein the landscape, allowing you to capture stunning panoramas of both Zermatt and the Matterhorn while uncovering more of the Alpine flora and fauna.

Day three: Zermatt

Small railways from Zermatt take you high up into the mountains, reaching 3000m above sea level, and the Glacier Paradise cable car transports you up to Europe's highest viewing platform. To extend both your experience of the railways of Valais and the mountains, take the Gornergratbahn up to the summit of the Gornergrat, from where you can bask in views of 38 mountain peaks. Consider visiting the Hornlihutte, where for decades climbers

have famously stayed as they prepare to climb the Matterhorn, via the Hornli Ridge, the Zmutt Ridge, or the north wall. For something wholly unique, spend an hour or two at the Zermatlantis Matterhorn Museum, a faithfully recreated archaeological site. After a thrilling and busy day exploring this dynamic area, dine in one of Zermatt's abundant gourmet restaurants or back at your chosen hotel.

Day four: Zermatt to St Moritz on the Glacier Express

Travel east from Zermatt to St Moritz on the iconic Glacier Express. Depart before 9am, with a view to arriving just after 5pm. The Glacier Express begins by taking you through small, picturesque villages and past monuments that have become emblematic for Valais, including the Stockalper Castle in Brig. We include a delicious three-course lunch based on a seasonal menu (drinks not included). Tasty specialities from the regions which you pass through are served to you at your seat by the friendly stewards, whilst you enjoy the changing scenery. The train then takes you through the Furka Tunnel of the Furka Steam Railway to Oberwald, weaving its way between traditional alpine chalets, the ice caves of the Rhone Glacier, and the vast panoramas of the mountainsides. Nestled in the indomitable Gotthard Pass, the train stops in the important north-south connection point of Andermatt. Cross the Oberalp Pass network of tunnels and viaducts to reach Disentis, crowned by its own Benedictine monastery. Take in the scenery of the Ruinaulta, and the fairytale rooftops of Chur, Switzerland's

oldest city. The castles and palaces of the Domleschg Region pass your windows as you gain on St Moritz, as well as the ochre-fronted houses and solitary tower of Tiefencastel and the idyllic summer resort of Davos. Join the Bernina Railway Line as you cross the Landwasser viaduct, navigate the loops of the track, and travel through the Albula Tunnel. With St Moritz not far away, pass through Bergun, dedicated to the wonders of Swiss rail, and Celerina, home to the Cresta Run. At 1856m above sea level, visitors to St Moritz are welcomed by stunning views across the lakes of the Upper Engadine Valley, and the refreshing dry, clear, Alpine climate.

Day five: St Moritz

Spend your time in St Moritz navigating the local peaks via railway, reaching the Piz Corvatsch, Chantarella, and Corviglia, where a cable car takes you up to Suvretta's most famous viewing point. If you have time, enjoy the water sports at the sublime Lake Sils and Lake St Moritz, or the windy Lake Silvaplana.

Day six: St Moritz to Tirano on the Bernina Express and Bernina Express PostBus to Lugano

You depart from St Moritz on the journey across northern Italy from St Moritz to Lugano. Board the distinctive red carriages of the Bernina Express train and first travel through the Val Benina, stopping in the quaint village of Pontresina. Then, the Bernina Express takes you around the Montebello Curve, which not only tackles the changing altitude in an innovative way, but allows you plenty of time

to take in the views of the Morteratsch Glacier. The train then hurtles on, gaining altitude once more until it reaches the highest point on the Rhaetian Railway, Ospizio Bernina, at 2253m above sea level. You will next pass Alp Grum, the only restaurant that is accessible exclusively by rail. Passing through grand and elegant Poschiavo and the small village of Le Prese, the Bernina Express finally brings you over the border into Italy. In Tirano, you have an hour to enjoy the charming combination of Italian architecture and Alpine backdrop. Perhaps stop off at the Santuario della Madonna di Tirano on the quiet central square, or seek out the historic monuments and paintings dotted around the town. Then, board the Bernina Express dedicated coach across to Lugano. Pass fertile green agricultural land, ancient towns and villages, flourishing green vineyards, and Lake Como on your way.

Day seven: Lugano

Use your time in Lugano to explore this cultural lakeside town, which is quintessential of the Ticino region. Lugano's Old Town will be one of the highlights of your stay here, with its relaxed café culture influenced by both the Italian border and the prominent Swiss towns to the north. Pay a visit to the Cathedral of Saint Lawrence, which sits at the top of the gently stepped Via Cattedrale. This Roman Catholic cathedral was founded in the Middle Ages, but was drastically rebuilt in the late 15th century. Its tower still rises high above Lugano, crowned by a distinctive green dome. For a further, more rounded, insight into Swiss cultural history, visit the waterside pink-fronted Museum of Cultures. Lake Lugano is perfect for a final sweeping boat trip, or for sampling the local water sports. The peak of nearby Monte Bre can be reached by funicular railway from Casserate, from where vou can take in the sublime views, seek out the forested beauty spots, and embark on a hiking trail. San Salvatore can also be reached by funicular railway from Lugano, and offers an alternative, but no less stunning, perspective.

Day eight: Lugano to Lucerne on the Gotthard Panorama Express

You will next embark on a route shaped by the legend of the Swiss National Hero of Liberty: Wilhelm Tell. Begin this journey by catching a train to Bellinzona, home to three of Switzerland's best-preserved Medieval castles, where you may need to change for Fluelen. This train journey weaves its way along the valleys of Ticino, passing the waterfalls of Biasca, the Italianate architecture of Faido, a series of historic isolated chalets, and the town of Airolo. On your way out of Ticino, you will pass through the Gotthard Strassentunnel, as well as the complex network of rail lines

in Goschenen. Navigate the Gotthard Loop Tunnels as you travel through the canton of Uri towards the southernmost point of Lake Lucerne. The railway track follows the course of the Reuss River, across flat, wide valleys as it loses altitude. In Fluelen, disembark the train and make your way to the nearby marina. Board the Gotthard Panorama Express steamboat or salon motorboat as you begin the true exploration of Wilhelm Tell's story. Pass the Rutli Meadows, where Friedrich Schiller's telling of the tale is set, and which was also the site on which a treaty was signed in 1291 between Lake Lucerne's neighbouring cantons. The boat also stops off in Sisikon, home to Tell's Chapel and Tell's Slab, where Wilhelm Tell reputedly jumped from the bailiff's boat and pushed it back into the stormy lake waters in the original story. Disembark from the boat at the lido of the Swiss Museum of Transport in Lucerne where you stay next.

Day nine: Lucerne

An essential visit on any stay in Lucerne is the Chapel Bridge, the city's main landmark and the most photographed monument in Switzerland. Walk along the bridge, taking in the views of the Reuss River, the so-called Water Spike, and the Water Tower. For both historical significance and architectural beauty, visit the 17th century Jesuit Church, which overlooks the water and is topped by two droplet-shaped domes. Above the city is the Musegg Wall, a 14th century structure that once protected the city within. Though the city now sprawls outside of this wall, the nine defensive towers still remain, three of

which are open to the public. Enjoy lunch in a pavement café on the Kornmarkt Square, beside the colourful Pfistern Guildhall, the Hirschenplatz Square, or the Weinmarkt Square, where Lucerne swore its federal oath with Schwyz, Uri, and Unterwalden. To see some exemplary Swiss culture, visit the prestigious KKL Luzern gallery, the Rosengart Collection of works by Picasso and Klee, the Wagner Museum in Tribschen, and the Swiss Museum of Transport. Finish your days with a sumptuous dinner back at your hotel, or in one of Lucerne's many gourmet restaurants.

Day ten: Lucerne to Bernese Oberland

This touring itinerary then takes you southwest from Lucerne into the Bernese Oberland. The train journey takes you along the western shore of Lake Lucerne, Lake Sarnen, Lake Lungern, and north around Lake Brienz. Change trains at Interlaken, perhaps spending an hour admiring the stunning location of this town, and move on up the steeper cog railway to Grindelwald or Wengen.

Day eleven: Bernese Oberland

The enchanting chocolate box villages of Grindelwald and Wengen afford stunning views of the surroundings from your location at over 1,000m above sea level. The two nearby villages are connected by two cable cars, by bus, or by train, and both sit at the base of the Jungfrau. Your stay here is therefore perfectly placed for enjoying the most iconic attraction of the Bernese Oberland. Travel by funicular railway up to Jungfraujoch, the highest railway

station in Europe, to appreciate the stunning views. For hiking trails, take cable cars up to the Monch and the Eiger, or simply follow the softer trails that lead out of Grindelwald. The picturesque Lake Fallboden makes for idyllic and relaxing afternoon and evening walks. Complete or begin your stay in Grindelwald with a self-guided stroll between the rustic wooden chalet houses.

Day twelve: Bernese Oberland to Saanenland

At around lunchtime, board the train from Grindelwald back to Interlaken, on to Zweisimmen, and then to Schoenried or Gstaad along the first section of the GoldenPass Line.

Day thirteen: Saanenland

On the border between the cantons of Bern and Vaud, the Saanenland marks the surreal convergence of five individual valleys. Schoenried itself sits on slightly higher ground than its famous neighbour, Gstaad. The area is known for its delicious Alpine dairy products, which are served in many of the 100 gourmet restaurants that line Gstaad's main promenade in the form of fondue or raclette. The boutique shops and quaint cafes housed inside these iconic chalets are well worth a few hours of your time as they capture a great deal of Swiss authenticity. The Molkerei Gstaad allows visitors to taste a selection of the 3,000 cheeses produced in the Saanenland. We would recommend spending a few hours in the Saanenland joining the dots between the traditional farmhouses that surround the fields outside Gstaad, and perhaps venturing further out on one of the hundreds of Alpine trails and paths. Adventurous visitors will want to take a trip up to Glacier 3000 to take in the views of 24 of the surrounding mountains that measure above 4000m. In the evenings, retire to your hotel in Schoenried or Gstaad for a gourmet dinner and a drink beside the cosy fireplace.

Day fourteen: Saanenland to Montreux on the GoldenPass Line

In the late morning, board one of the panoramic coaches of the GoldenPass Line for the two hour journey from Schoenried to Montreux. After Gstaad, the GoldenPass Line crosses the border into Vaud, stopping first in Rougemont, and then Chateau-d'Oex. Here the mountainscapes are dotted with quaint chalets, small churches, and petit castles; an image that is very typical of the Pays-d'Enhaut. The villages you will pass next all retain their own individual architectural character, emerging out of plumes of evergreen trees. In Rossiniere and Montbovon, passengers can view the startling translucent

turquoise water that runs in rivers crossed by ancient wooden bridges. At Les Avants, the train begins to wind its way down the hillside towards Montreux.

Day fifteen: Montreux

During your stay in Montreux, we would recommend exploring the railway history of the area, taking the Vineyard Train (S31) through the Lavaux Terraced Vineyards between Vevey and Puixdoux-Chexbres, the train through the meadows to Rochers-de-Naye (on which you can sometimes see the Jet d'Eau in Geneva), or the Chocolate Train to the Maison Cailler chocolate factory and museum. The highlight of your visit to Montreux, however, may well be Chillon Castle, perched on a rocky outcrop and seemingly emerging out of the water. This is Switzerland's most popular historical landmark, and, with its fairy-tale beauty, it is easy to see why.

Day sixteen: Depart Geneva to UK

On your final day, enjoy a relaxing morning beside the waterfront on Lake Geneva before making your way back to the UK.

OPTIONAL

If you are arriving from or returning to the UK by rail, we would recommend spending an extra night in Geneva at the beginning or end of your tour. It is also possible to add additional nights in any of the destinations mentioned.



GENERAL INFORMATION

This rail holiday is one of several suggested rail holidays we can offer you exactly as it is but also with any alterations you might want including extra nights in one or more places or adding in extra places. All our tours can be extended so that you can include a longer stay in one mountain or lake resort too, perhaps at the end of the itinerary. Do call to discuss the options with our travel consultants.



OUR TOURS

Our rail tours are for individuals travelling on their own or in their own family group. You do not join a group and you are not escorted.

FLEXIBLE ARRANGEMENTS

Our arrangements are very flexible in that you choose to travel on any day you want, subject to availability of trains and hotels. As mentioned above, additional nights can be added at any point.

FLEX PASS INCLUDED

We include travel to and from your first and last hotel but also a Flex pass is included for the rest of the holiday, depending on its length. For example, on a long stay we would include an 8 day Flex pass. This gives you 8 non-consecutive but selected days of travel within a one-month period.

The pass gives you a choice that includes

- Unlimited travel by rail, road and waterway on your selected days of validity, including most panorama routes and public transport in 75 towns and cities
- Free admission to more than 490 museums on the selected days of validity
- Children under the age of 16 travel free of charge when accompanied by at least one parent holding the Swiss Family Card

If we have included a panoramic route in your holiday, we will automatically include any applicable supplements for that train.

TRAIN TIMES

We have planned our itineraries based on train times that work day by day at the time of planning which can be up to a year before you travel. Usually train times stay more or less the same every day, season by season. The times we have planned will be discussed with you at the time you enquire about the holiday and they are detailed to you in your written holiday quotation. It may be that the timetable changes between the planning of the itinerary and when you come to book but we can always adjust the itinerary to suit the actual train times and any requirements you have for particular times of travel.

FIRST OR SECOND CLASS

We will automatically include travel in second class but lots of our clients do upgrade to first class service. On Eurostar this is called Premier Standard for leisure travellers as it gives you an upgraded on-board service and more spacious seating but without paying for the fully-flexible business tickets. On the TGV trains from France to Switzerland, upgrading to first class gives you more spacious seating with increased legroom. Within Switzerland, first class gives you again more space and more comfortable seats, often with a quieter environment. The price of upgrading varies from route to route but is something that is not always proportionately a lot more on the price of the overall holiday, so well-worth considering.

LUGGAGE TRANSFER SERVICE

Swiss rail operates an efficient transfer service for your luggage. This works in a number of ways:

For travel to Switzerland by air, you can checkin your baggage with any airline, from any airport in the world and it will be forwarded to our destination station in Switzerland from Zurich, Bern or Geneva airports. Simply collect your baggage from the station at your destination.

For departure from Switzerland if flying with Swiss, you can check-in for your flight at the train station the day before you fly (major stations only). You receive your boarding pass and your seat allocation and your baggage will be transported onto the aircraft.

For departure from Switzerland with other airlines eg British Airways or Easyjet, you can

airlines eg British Airways or Easyjet, you can have your baggage transported to the airport train station ie Zurich or Geneva and you collect it from there to take it to check-in as usual. Just allow enough time for the luggage to reach the airport station, so well before you travel. Your station will be able to advise a day or two beforehand.

Within Switzerland you can transfer your luggage from one location to another. The Fast Baggage service is available between 45 destinations. You just have to check-in your luggage before 9am at your departure station and collect it by 6pm on the same day at your destination (or sometimes the following day, depending on the actual destination). The cost of this service is approximately £17 per item. TRANSFERS

Transfers in Paris between stations and from the station to each hotel are not automatically included in the price of the holiday. In Paris most clients choose to take a taxi between the stations rather than go on the Metro but we can arrange a private car with driver to take you in between. This is quite useful if you are a family group that can't fit into one Paris taxi. In Switzerland, depending on the location, hotels sometimes have their own transfer vehicles that they will send to collect you if we advise them in advance (eg in St Moritz and Zermatt this is usual) but elsewhere some hotels are within walking distance and others are a short taxi ride away.



OUR PRICES

The sample prices mentioned in this leaflet are generally a 'from' price based on the cheapest season of travel. However, train fares and hotel rates can change (up and down depending on offers), so we give you an accurate price for your holiday when we provide you with a quotation. Travel on three of Switzerland's most iconic railway lines, the GoldenPass Line, the Glacier Express, and the Bernina Express, as you trace the pattern of valleys and mountains all around the country. Spend nights beside the Matterhorn, Suvretta Mountain, the Jungfrau, the Gornergrat, Monte Tamaro, Rigi Mountain, and the Wispile, navigating their dramatic relief via funicular railways, cable cars, and internationally renowned trains.

This grand tour of Switzerland begins with your arrival into Zurich, either by rail or by air. From here, you catch a train southwest to Lucerne, staying beside the lake, taking in the most popular cultural sights, including the Chapel Bridge and Water Tower. Then, move on into the Bernese Oberland in the chocolate box villages of Grindelwald or Wengen in the Lutschine Valley. This is the perfect opportunity to ascend the Jungfrau by rail to Jungfraujoch, the highest railway station in Europe. Next, continue west into the Saanenland, staying in either Schoenried or Gstaad. Here, five valleys meet to create a wide, picturesque bowl of green plains between countless mountain peaks. You then catch the GoldenPass Line from the Saanenland to Montreux beside Lake Geneva. Travel south into the Valais to Zermatt at the foot of the Matterhorn. Spend a couple of days under the brooding stare of Switzerland's most famous mountain before continuing on via the Glacier Express to Lugano in Ticino. The icy Alpine landscapes of Valais here blur into the lush green Mediterranean fields and hills of Ticino. Lugano will be your host while you explore the eponymous lake and nearby Monte Tamaro. You round off your holiday to Switzerland in St Moritz, after

taking the Bernina Express bus and train via Lake Como and Tirano in northern Italy. On your last day, re-board the Bernina Express to Chur, where you change trains for Zurich. Should you wish to return to the UK by rail, we would recommend spending an extra night in Zurich before departure, though flights can be arranged on the same day.

DAY-BY-DAY ITINERARY

Lake Lucerne - Bernese Oberland - GoldenPass Line - Saanenland - Lake Geneva - Zermatt - Glacier Express - Lake Lugano - Bernina Express - St Moritz



Day one: Travel to Lucerne via Zurich

Choose to either arrive in Zurich by air or to travel by rail via Paris and Basel to Lucerne, depending on time constraints and preferences. If travelling via Zurich, either spend an hour or two exploring this crisp, historic city, or immediately board the train to Lucerne. This short train journey leaves you plenty of time to explore the city before retiring to your choice of luxury hotel.

Day two: Lucerne

An essential visit on any stay in Lucerne is the Chapel Bridge, the city's main landmark and the most photographed monument in Switzerland. Walk along the bridge, taking in the views of the Reuss River, the so-called Water Spike, and the Water Tower. For both historical significance and architectural beauty, visit the 17th century Jesuit Church, which overlooks the water and is topped by two droplet-shaped domes. Above the city is the Musegg Wall, a 14th century structure that once protected the city within. Though the city now sprawls outside of this wall, the nine defensive towers still remain, three of which are open to the public. Enjoy lunch in a pavement café on the Kornmarkt Square, beside the colourful Pfistern Guildhall, the Hirschenplatz Square, or the Weinmarkt Square, where Lucerne swore its federal oath with Schwyz, Uri, and Unterwalden. To see some exemplary Swiss culture, visit the prestigious KKL Luzern gallery, the Rosengart Collection of works by Picasso and Klee, the Wagner Museum in Tribschen, and the Swiss Museum of Transport. Finish your days with a sumptuous dinner back at your hotel, or in one of Lucerne's many gourmet restaurants.

Day three: Lucerne to Bernese Oberland

This touring itinerary then takes you southwest from Lucerne into the Bernese Oberland. The train journey takes you along the western shore of Lake Lucerne, Lake Sarnen, Lake Lungern, and north around Lake Brienz. Change trains at Interlaken, perhaps spending an hour admiring the stunning location of this town, and move on up the steeper cog railway to Grindelwald or Wengen.

Day four: Bernese Oberland

The enchanting chocolate box villages of Grindelwald and Wengen afford stunning views of the surroundings from your location at over 1,000m above sea level. The two nearby villages are connected by two cable cars, by bus, or by train, and both sit at the base of the Jungfrau. Your stay here is therefore perfectly placed for enjoying the most iconic attraction

of the Bernese Oberland. Travel by funicular railway up to Jungfraujoch, the highest railway station in Europe, to appreciate the stunning views. For hiking trails, take cable cars up to the Monch and the Eiger, or simply follow the softer trails that lead out of Grindelwald. The picturesque Lake Fallboden makes for idyllic and relaxing afternoon and evening walks. Complete or begin your stay in Grindelwald with a self-guided stroll between the rustic wooden chalet houses.

Day five: Bernese Oberland to Saanenland

At around lunchtime, board the train from Grindelwald back to Interlaken, on to Zweisimmen, and then to Schoenried or Gstaad along the first section of the GoldenPass Line.

Day six: Saanenland

On the border between the cantons of Bern and Vaud, the Saanenland marks the surreal convergence of five individual valleys. Schoenried itself sits on slightly higher ground than its famous neighbour, Gstaad. The area is known for its delicious Alpine dairy products, which are served in many of the 100 gourmet restaurants that line Gstaad's main promenade in the form of fondue or raclette. The boutique shops and quaint cafes housed inside these iconic chalets are well worth a few hours of your time as they capture a great deal of Swiss authenticity. The Molkerei Gstaad allows visitors to taste a selection of the 3,000 cheeses produced in the Saanenland. We

would recommend spending a few hours in the Saanenland joining the dots between the traditional farmhouses that surround the fields outside Gstaad, and perhaps venturing further out on one of the hundreds of Alpine trails and paths. Adventurous visitors will want to take a trip up to Glacier 3000 to take in the views of 24 of the surrounding mountains that measure above 4000m. In the evenings, retire to your hotel in Schoenried or Gstaad for a gourmet dinner and a drink beside the cosy fireplace.

Day seven: Saanenland to Montreux on the Golden Pass Line

In the late morning, board one of the panoramic coaches of the GoldenPass Line for the two hour journey from Schoenried to Montreux. After Gstaad, the GoldenPass Line crosses the border into Vaud, stopping first in Rougemont, and then Chateau-d'Oex. Here the mountainscapes are dotted with quaint chalets, small churches, and petit castles; an image that is very typical of the Pays-d'Enhaut. The villages you will pass next all retain their own individual architectural character, emerging out of plumes of evergreen trees. In Rossiniere and Montbovon, passengers can view the startling translucent turquoise water that runs in rivers crossed by ancient wooden bridges. At Les Avants, the train begins to wind its way down the hillside towards Montreux, where you will stay for one night on the banks of Lake Geneva. During your stay in Montreux, we would recommend exploring the railway history of the area, taking the Vineyard Train (S31) through the

This is Switzerland's most popular historical landmark, and, with its fairy-tale beauty, it is easy to see why.

Day eight: Montreux to Zermatt

Today you travel by train from Montreux to Zermatt. This train journey takes around two and a half hours, passing Chillon Castle, Martigny, and pausing at Visp while you change trains. As you enter Zermatt, the area's crowning glory will make itself apparent: the Matterhorn. Around it, over 400km of walking and hiking paths vein the landscape, allowing you to capture stunning panoramas of both Zermatt and the Matterhorn while uncovering more of the Alpine flora and fauna.

Day nine: Zermatt

Small railways from Zermatt take you high up into the mountains, reaching 3000m above sea level, and the Glacier Paradise cable car transports you up to Europe's highest viewing platform. To extend both your experience of the railways of Valais and the mountains, take the Gornergratbahn up to the summit of the Gornergrat, from where you can bask in views of 38 mountain peaks. Consider visiting the Hornlihutte, where for decades climbers have famously stayed as they prepare to climb the Matterhorn, via the Hornli Ridge, the Zmutt Ridge, or the north wall. For something wholly unique, spend an hour or two at the Zermatlantis Matterhorn Museum, a faithfully recreated archaeological site. After a thrilling and busy day exploring this dynamic area, dine in one of Zermatt's abundant gourmet restaurants or back at your chosen hotel.

Day ten: Zermatt to Lugano via the Glacier Express

Today you board one of the distinctive carriages of the Glacier Express to Andermatt, where you change trains on your way to Lugano. This short stretch of the Glacier Express takes you first through the enchanting village of St Niklaus, defined by its rustic chalet houses with peaked roofs, and then onto Brig, where the 17th century Stockalper Castle stands proudly at the centre of the Old Town, crowned by unusual onion domes. The Glacier Express then takes you through the Furka Tunnel of the Furka Steam Railway, past the ice caves of the Rhone Glacier, and over the

bridge in Oberwald. At Andermatt, you cease journeying east and turn immediately south into the province of Ticino. Follow a single main valley as the environment becomes gradually more Mediterranean and the climate becomes warmer. Trickling waterfalls spill out of the mountainsides, and sparsely populated villages spread across flat valley floors. This train passes through Bellinzona, the most Italianate town in Switzerland. Here, three castles stand opposite each other on green bluffs, forming a single well-preserved UNESCO World Heritage Site. Lake Maggiore is visible in the distance as you continue further south past Monte Tamaro towards Lake Lugano and your destination. Arrive in the afternoon and if possible take the funicular railway up to the summit of Monte Bre from Casserate, or simply sit back and enjoy the Mediterranean feel of the waterside in this colourful city.

Day eleven: Lugano to St Moritz on the Bernina Express coach and train

You depart Lugano by yet another mode of transport: the Bernina Express coach. The Bernina Express bus from Lugano to Tirano in Italy leaves at around 10am, arriving three hours later and passing Lake Como and the picturesque villages of northern Italy on its way. In Tirano, you have an hour to enjoy the charming combination of Italian architecture and Alpine backdrop. Perhaps stop off at the Santuario della Madonna di Tirano on the quiet central square, or seek out the historic

monuments and paintings dotted around the town. Then, embark on the final part of your Bernina Express journey, ready to arrive into St Moritz two hours later. This stretch takes you past thriving orchards and vineyards, over the unique Brusio viaduct as it spirals back on itself to compensate for the changing altitudes, and into Le Prese over the Swiss border. 

GENERAL INFORMATION

This rail holiday is one of several suggested rail holidays we can offer you exactly as it is but also with any alterations you might want including extra nights in one or more places or adding in extra places. All our tours can be extended so that you can include a longer stay in one mountain or lake resort too, perhaps at the end of the itinerary. Do call to discuss the options with our travel consultants.



OUR TOURS

Our rail tours are for individuals travelling on their own or in their own family group. You do not join a group and you are not escorted.

FLEXIBLE ARRANGEMENTS

Our arrangements are very flexible in that you choose to travel on any day you want, subject to availability of trains and hotels. As mentioned above, additional nights can be added at any point.

FLEX PASS INCLUDED

We include travel to and from your first and last hotel but also a Flex pass is included for the rest of the holiday, depending on its length. For example, on a long stay we would include an 8 day Flex pass. This gives you 8 non-consecutive but selected days of travel within a one-month period.

The pass gives you a choice that includes

- Unlimited travel by rail, road and waterway on your selected days of validity, including most panorama routes and public transport in 75 towns and cities
- Free admission to more than 490 museums on the selected days of validity
- Children under the age of 16 travel free of charge when accompanied by at least one parent holding the Swiss Family Card

If we have included a panoramic route in your holiday, we will automatically include any applicable supplements for that train.

TRAIN TIMES

We have planned our itineraries based on train times that work day by day at the time of planning which can be up to a year before you travel. Usually train times stay more or less the same every day, season by season. The times we have planned will be discussed with you at the time you enquire about the holiday and they are detailed to you in your written holiday quotation. It may be that the timetable changes between the planning of the itinerary and when you come to book but we can always adjust the itinerary to suit the actual train times and any requirements you have for particular times of travel.

FIRST OR SECOND CLASS

We will automatically include travel in second class but lots of our clients do upgrade to first class service. On Eurostar this is called Premier Standard for leisure travellers as it gives you an upgraded on-board service and more spacious seating but without paying for the fully-flexible business tickets. On the TGV trains from France to Switzerland, upgrading to first class gives you more spacious seating with increased legroom. Within Switzerland, first class gives you again more space and more comfortable seats, often with a quieter environment. The price of upgrading varies from route to route but is something that is not always proportionately a lot more on the price of the overall holiday, so well-worth considering.

LUGGAGE TRANSFER SERVICE

Swiss rail operates an efficient transfer service for your luggage. This works in a number of ways:

For travel to Switzerland by air, you can checkin your baggage with any airline, from any airport in the world and it will be forwarded to our destination station in Switzerland from Zurich, Bern or Geneva airports. Simply collect your baggage from the station at your destination.

For departure from Switzerland if flying with Swiss, you can check-in for your flight at the train station the day before you fly (major stations only). You receive your boarding pass and your seat allocation and your baggage will be transported onto the aircraft.

For departure from Switzerland with other airlines eg British Airways or Easyjet, you can

airlines eg British Airways or Easyjet, you can have your baggage transported to the airport train station ie Zurich or Geneva and you collect it from there to take it to check-in as usual. Just allow enough time for the luggage to reach the airport station, so well before you travel. Your station will be able to advise a day or two beforehand.

Within Switzerland you can transfer your luggage from one location to another. The Fast Baggage service is available between 45 destinations. You just have to check-in your luggage before 9am at your departure station and collect it by 6pm on the same day at your destination (or sometimes the following day, depending on the actual destination). The cost of this service is approximately £17 per item. TRANSFERS

Transfers in Paris between stations and from the station to each hotel are not automatically included in the price of the holiday. In Paris most clients choose to take a taxi between the stations rather than go on the Metro but we can arrange a private car with driver to take you in between. This is quite useful if you are a family group that can't fit into one Paris taxi. In Switzerland, depending on the location, hotels sometimes have their own transfer vehicles that they will send to collect you if we advise them in advance (eg in St Moritz and Zermatt this is usual) but elsewhere some hotels are within walking distance and others are a short taxi ride away.



OUR PRICES

The sample prices mentioned in this leaflet are generally a 'from' price based on the cheapest season of travel. However, train fares and hotel rates can change (up and down depending on offers), so we give you an accurate price for your holiday when we provide you with a quotation. Our sample prices should be used as an indication of how much a particular combination will cost and to show the differences on average between the hotel categories on

DAY-BY-DAY ITINERARY

Lake Geneva - GoldenPass Line - Saanenland - Bernese Oberland - Lake Lucerne - Gotthard - Gotthard Panorama Express - Lake Lugano - Bernina Express - Bernina Pass - St Moritz - Lake Zurich



Days one and two: Geneva to Lausanne

Travel by rail or by air from London to Geneva on your first day. Perhaps spend an hour or two exploring the city, home to fine watch-making, the headquarters of the UN, and the Jet d'Eau fountain. Wander around the Vielle-Villa, the largest Old Town in Switzerland, stopping at the St Pierre Cathedral. From Geneva, catch a train along the northern shore of the lake to Lausanne. During your time in Lausanne, choose from its many elegant attractions; seek out the impressive historic monuments as well as the new, modern additions, Lausanne Cathedral is believed to be one of Europe's most beautiful Gothic monuments, crowned by spires of unusual purple and orange hues. A brand new Olympic Museum has recently opened in the heart of Lausanne's Old Town: three levels depict Olympic history in all its colourful grandeur. The placement of this new museum comes as a result of the Olympic Committee Headquarters being in Lausanne. The Olympic Park is adjoined to the museum, and is dotted with artworks, sports sculptures, and well-maintained flowers and trees. Beside the Olympic Park is the promenade at Ouchy Harbour, which, when lit up in the evening, will be one of the highlights of your trip. The promenade takes you from the gardens along to the Haldimand Tower, the Bellerive Swimming Pool, the Chateau d'Ouchy, and the port. Enjoy dinner in this beautiful area before returning to your hotel.

Day three: Lausanne to Grindelwald via the GoldenPass line

The next leg of your journey takes you to the eastern point of Lake Geneva, in Montreux, home to Chillon Castle, Switzerland's most popular historical monument. In Montreux, change trains to the GoldenPass Line and zig-zag your way up to higher ground as you begin the journey to Grindelwald in the Bernese Oberland. The distinctive golden carriages of the GoldenPass Line take you first through the villages above Montreux, where the houses become sparser and have more individualistic architecture. Pass the turquoise waters and wooden bridges of Montbovon and enter Saanenland in Chateau d-Oex, where the mountain chalets begin to become more prominent. Emerge from a gently curving valley into the flat plains around Gstaad that are formed by the convergence of five valleys. Ascend to Schoenried, and then to Zweisimmen, the so-called 'gateway' to the Saanenland. The landscape here becomes jagged as severe bluffs and mountain peaks burst out of areas of thick, rich forest. The Stockhorn Rock between Boltigen and

Erlenbach im Simmental marks your entrance to the Bernese Oberland. Pass through flourishing natural beauty in the Nature Park of Diemtigtal and trace the shores of Lake Thun before you reach Interlaken, where you change trains for Grindelwald. The journey takes around three hours in total, bringing you into Grindelwald in the early afternoon.

Day four: Grindelwald

Grindelwald is an enchanting chocolate box village, scattered across the gentle green slopes of the Lutschine Valley. The nearby village of Wengen, accessible via two cable cars, by bus, or by train, sits at the base of the Jungfrau. Your stay in Grindelwald is therefore perfectly placed for enjoying the most iconic attraction of the Bernese Oberland. Travel by funicular railway up to Jungfraujoch, the highest railway station in Europe, to appreciate the stunning views. For hiking trails, take cable cars up the Monch and the Eiger, or simply follow the softer trails that lead out of Grindelwald. The picturesque Lake Fallboden makes for idyllic and relaxing afternoon and evening walks. Complete or begin your stay in Grindelwald with a self-guided stroll between the rustic wooden chalet houses.

Day five: Grindelwald to Lucerne

Leave Grindelwald around midday, changing trains at Interlaken, to arrive into Lucerne at around 3pm. This journey takes you along the extension of the GoldenPass line, a scenic journey past many of the sparkling lakes of central Switzerland.

Days six and seven: Lucerne

An essential visit on any stay in Lucerne is

the Chapel Bridge, the city's main landmark and the most photographed monument in Switzerland. Walk along the bridge, taking in the views of the Reuss River, the so-called Water Spike, and the Water Tower. For both historical significance and architectural beauty, visit the 17th century Jesuit Church, which overlooks the water and is topped by two droplet-shaped domes. Above the city is the Musegg Wall, a 14th century structure that once protected the city within. Though the city now sprawls outside of this wall, the nine defensive towers still remain, three of which are open to the public. Enjoy lunch in a pavement café on the Kornmarkt Square, beside the colourful Pfistern Guildhall, the Hirschenplatz Square, or the Weinmarkt Square, where Lucerne swore its federal oath with Schwyz, Uri, and Unterwalden. To see some exemplary Swiss culture, visit the prestigious KKL Luzern gallery, the Rosengart Collection of works by Picasso and Klee, the Wagner Museum in Tribschen, and the Swiss Museum of Transport. Finish your days with a sumptuous dinner back at your hotel, or in one of Lucerne's many gourmet restaurants.

Day eight: Lucerne to Lugano on the Gotthard Panorama Express

Heading south, you adopt a different form of transport in order to cross Lake Lucerne. The Gotthard Panorama Express begins with either a salon motorboat or a steamboat, which docks at various places mentioned in the legend of the Swiss National Hero of Liberty, Wilhelm Tell. See the site where Tell reputedly jumped from the bailiff's ship before pushing it

and its crew back into the stormy lake waters, and the meadows of Rutli, where Friedrich Schiller set his popular recounting of the tale. When you reach Fluelen, perhaps take the time to wander along the narrow promenade that separates the harbour from the lake, before boarding the Gotthard Panorama Express train on your way to Lugano. Here, the railway track runs along the Reuss River, across wide, flat valleys until the track gains altitude and chocolate box villages dot the hillsides. Navigate the Gotthard Loop Tunnels, passing through the complex rail network of Goschenen, and entering the province of Ticino at Airolo through the Gotthard Strassentunnel. The train now follows the River Ticino past the waterfalls of Biasca, the Italianate architecture of Faido, and the historic solitary chalets. When you reach Bellinzona, disembark for the train to Lugano. This is the most Italianate town in Switzerland, distinctive because of its three medieval castles that stand on hilly bluffs and form a united UNESCO World Heritage Site. The journey from Bellinzona to Lugano is an incredibly short one, bringing you into Lugano at around half two in the afternoon.

Day nine: Lugano

Use your time in Lugano to explore this cultural lakeside town, which is quintessential of the Ticino region. Lugano's Old Town will be one of the highlights of your stay here, with its relaxed café culture influenced by both the Italian border and the prominent Swiss towns to the north. Pay a visit to the Cathedral of Saint Lawrence, which sits at the top of the gently stepped Via Cattedrale. This Roman Catholic cathedral was founded in the Middle Ages, but was drastically rebuilt in the late 15th century. Its tower still rises high above Lugano, crowned by a distinctive green dome. For a further, more rounded, insight into Swiss cultural history, visit the waterside pink-fronted Museum of Cultures. Lake Lugano is perfect for a final sweeping boat trip, or for sampling the local water sports. The peak of nearby Monte Bre can be reached by funicular railway from Casserate, from where you can take in the sublime views, seek out the forested beauty spots, and embark on a hiking trail. San Salvatore can also be reached by funicular railway from Lugano, and offers an alternative, but no less stunning, perspective.

Day ten: Lugano to St Moritz on the Bernina Express coach and train

You depart Lugano by yet another mode of transport: the Bernina Express coach. The Bernina Express bus from Lugano to Tirano in Italy leaves at around 10am, arriving three hours later and passing Lake Como and the

picturesque villages of northern Italy on its way. In Tirano, you have an hour to enjoy the charming combination of Italian architecture and Alpine backdrop. Perhaps stop off at the Santuario della Madonna di Tirano on the quiet central square, or seek out the historic monuments and paintings dotted around the town. Then, embark on the final part of your Bernina Express journey, ready to arrive into St Moritz two hours later. This stretch takes you past thriving orchards and vineyards, over the unique Brusio viaduct as it spirals back on itself to compensate for the changing altitudes, and into Le Prese over the Swiss border. Continue on through the Bergamo Alps, through grand and regal Poschiavo and the Val Poschiavo, passing Alp Grum, the only restaurant to be exclusively accessible by rail. The Bernina Express now begins its ascent to the highest point on the Rhaetian Railway in Ospizio Bernina. Before arriving into St Moritz, you will pass two of the most famous sights on this railway: the Montebello Curve and the Morteratsch Glacier. The Curve itself allows you plentiful time to appreciate the views of the glacier. Arrive into St Moritz in Switzerland, perhaps using your time here to reach the best viewing point of the Suvretta Mountain by cable car, or to visit Lake Sils, Lake St Moritz, or the windy Lake Silvaplana. The neighbouring mountains, including the Piz Corvatsch, Chantarella, and Corviglia, can all be explored by rail..

Day eleven: St Moritz to Zurich via Chur

We recommend spending the morning in

St Moritz and then departing by rail around lunchtime to Zurich via the oldest town in Switzerland: Chur. This route takes you first to Chur, past the Cresta Run in Celerina, the Albula Railway Museum in Bergun, the towering Landwasser viaduct in the Domleschg Region, the popular resort of Davos, the stone bridges and ochre houses of Tiefencastel, and the sublime Ruinaulta, before arriving in the 'Alpine City.' Change to a direct train to Zurich, which takes just over an hour and skirts around Lake Walen and Lake Zurich on the way. Stay in a luxury Zurich hotel, perhaps taking a river or lake cruise, enjoying a drink in a Badi-Bar on the lakefront, and climbing to the top of the Karlsturm, one of the Grossmunster Church's two iconic towers. The oldest district in Zurich, and home to the silk-making industry, is Schipfe; perhaps enjoy the luxuries at one of the bathhouses here or seek out the boat-builders' workshops. Visit the Lindenhof District to see the site of a 4th century Roman Fort as well as Charlemagne's grandson's 9th century palace. Complete your stay in Zurich with dinner in an authentic restaurant in the Niederdorf District, a ride on the Little Red Train up to the Polyterrasse, a visit to the Kunsthaus Art Museum, or a walk around the city joining the dots between some of the 1,200 water fountains.

Day twelve: Return to the UK

On your final day, enjoy a relaxing morning at your choice of hotel before heading to Zurich International Airport for your return flight or to the station for your rail journey home.

At Lausanne, Grindelwald, Lucerne, Weggis, Lugano, St Moritz, and Zurich, you can choose between a range of different luxury hotels, details of which can be found below.

Each of its buildings is strikingly different from the outside, but with the same elegant interiors and fantastic service. L'Accademia is reputedly the best Italian restaurant in Lausanne.

Hotel Beau Rivage Palace 5 star

This elegant spa hotel has a stunning, palatial façade, beautifully grand, ornate rooms, and convenient tennis facilities. Diverse internationally-inspired dining options provide plenty of indulgent options for evening meals. From the outdoor pool, guests can see Lake Geneva, and the mountains on the other side. This hotel is just a short walk from Ouchy Harbour.

This attractive, traditional hotel has an abundance of authentic Swiss character, from the dark wood chalet exterior, to the rich, cosy colours of the interiors. A 'stubli' style restaurant serves guests a range of Swiss specialities, a comfortable lounge and a picturesque garden provide hours of relaxation, and the idyllic spa offers a place to relax after a day exploring the mountains of the Bernese Oberland.

LUCERNE

Hotel Waldstaetterhof 3 star

This centrally-located hotel offers sleek, bold accommodation that strikingly contrasts the fairy-tale appearance of its 20th century townhouse exterior. Polished wooden floors, white walls and bedsheets, and bold reds, blues, or greens create a very warm feel, which is complemented by the sharp lines, feature colours, and unique ornaments of the restaurant and bar.

GENERAL INFORMATION

This rail holiday is one of several suggested rail holidays we can offer you exactly as it is but also with any alterations you might want including extra nights in one or more places or adding in extra places. All our tours can be extended so that you can include a longer stay in one mountain or lake resort too, perhaps at the end of the itinerary. Do call to discuss the options with our travel consultants.



OUR TOURS

Our rail tours are for individuals travelling on their own or in their own family group. You do not join a group and you are not escorted.

FLEXIBLE ARRANGEMENTS

Our arrangements are very flexible in that you choose to travel on any day you want, subject to availability of trains and hotels. As mentioned above, additional nights can be added at any point.

FLEX PASS INCLUDED

We include travel to and from your first and last hotel but also a Flex pass is included for the rest of the holiday, depending on its length. For example, on a long stay we would include an 8 day Flex pass. This gives you 8 non-consecutive but selected days of travel within a one-month period.

The pass gives you a choice that includes

- Unlimited travel by rail, road and waterway on your selected days of validity, including most panorama routes and public transport in 75 towns and cities
- Free admission to more than 490 museums on the selected days of validity
- Children under the age of 16 travel free of charge when accompanied by at least one parent holding the Swiss Family Card

If we have included a panoramic route in your holiday, we will automatically include any applicable supplements for that train.

TRAIN TIMES

We have planned our itineraries based on train times that work day by day at the time of planning which can be up to a year before you travel. Usually train times stay more or less the same every day, season by season. The times we have planned will be discussed with you at the time you enquire about the holiday and they are detailed to you in your written holiday quotation. It may be that the timetable changes between the planning of the itinerary and when you come to book but we can always adjust the itinerary to suit the actual train times and any requirements you have for particular times of travel.

FIRST OR SECOND CLASS

We will automatically include travel in second class but lots of our clients do upgrade to first class service. On Eurostar this is called Premier Standard for leisure travellers as it gives you an upgraded on-board service and more spacious seating but without paying for the fully-flexible business tickets. On the TGV trains from France to Switzerland, upgrading to first class gives you more spacious seating with increased legroom. Within Switzerland, first class gives you again more space and more comfortable seats, often with a quieter environment. The price of upgrading varies from route to route but is something that is not always proportionately a lot more on the price of the overall holiday, so well-worth considering.

LUGGAGE TRANSFER SERVICE

Swiss rail operates an efficient transfer service for your luggage. This works in a number of ways:

For travel to Switzerland by air, you can checkin your baggage with any airline, from any airport in the world and it will be forwarded to our destination station in Switzerland from Zurich, Bern or Geneva airports. Simply collect your baggage from the station at your destination.

For departure from Switzerland if flying with Swiss, you can check-in for your flight at the train station the day before you fly (major stations only). You receive your boarding pass and your seat allocation and your baggage will be transported onto the aircraft.

For departure from Switzerland with other

airlines eg British Airways or Easyjet, you can have your baggage transported to the airport train station ie Zurich or Geneva and you collect it from there to take it to check-in as usual. Just allow enough time for the luggage to reach the airport station, so well before you travel. Your station will be able to advise a day or two beforehand.

Within Switzerland you can transfer your luggage from one location to another. The Fast Baggage service is available between 45 destinations. You just have to check-in your luggage before 9am at your departure station and collect it by 6pm on the same day at your destination (or sometimes the following day, depending on the actual destination). The cost of this service is approximately £17 per item. TRANSFERS

Transfers in Paris between stations and from the station to each hotel are not automatically included in the price of the holiday. In Paris most clients choose to take a taxi between the stations rather than go on the Metro but we can arrange a private car with driver to take you in between. This is quite useful if you are a family group that can't fit into one Paris taxi. In Switzerland, depending on the location, hotels sometimes have their own transfer vehicles that they will send to collect you if we advise them in advance (eg in St Moritz and Zermatt this is usual) but elsewhere some hotels are within walking distance and others are a short taxi ride away.



OUR PRICES

The sample prices mentioned in this leaflet are generally a 'from' price based on the cheapest season of travel. However, train fares and hotel rates can change (up and down depending on offers), so we give you an accurate price for your holiday when we provide you with a quotation. This romantic touring holiday takes you from Lake Geneva, down into Mediterranean-style Ticino, back up to Lake Lucerne, and then into the lush countryside of the Saanenland.

Begin this touring holiday with a rail or air journey into Geneva, from where you travel on to Lausanne for your first night in Switzerland. Choose from our selection of luxury Lausanne hotels for this night, before catching a train the next morning to Montreux. Here, you change trains and head for Visp, where you change for Zermatt. Spend a few nights in Zermatt, taking in the sights of the Matterhorn, and a ride on the Gornergratbahn. Then the Glacier Express takes you to Brig, where you change for Domodossola to join the Centovalli Express. This iconic train journey is one of the most romantic in Europe, and takes you through to Locarno. Enjoy Lake Maggiore and the colourful streets here, before heading north to Lucerne on the Gotthard Panorama Express train and boat. Your time in Lucerne allows you to explore the lakeside, and perhaps travel further northeast to Zurich for a few hours. From here, travel down to Zweisimmen, where you join the GoldenPass Line for the remaining journey into the Saanenland. Your last stop id Gstaad or Schoenried before traveling once again by the GoldenPass Line into Montreux, and then on to Geneva for your return flight. If you intend to return home by train, we would recommend spending another night in Geneva before departure.

DAY-BY-DAY ITINERARY

Lake Geneva - Zermatt - Glacier Express - Centovalli Express - Gotthard Panorama Express - Lake Maggiore - Gotthard - Lake Lucerne - GoldenPass Line - Saanenland



Day one: Arrive Geneva and train to Lausanne

Travel by rail or by air from London to Geneva on your first day. Perhaps spend an hour or two exploring the city, home to fine watch-making, the headquarters of the UN, and the Jet d'Eau fountain. Wander around the Vielle-Villa, the largest Old Town in Switzerland, stopping at the St Pierre Cathedral. From Geneva, catch a train along the northern shore of the lake to Lausanne. During your time in Lausanne, choose from its many elegant attractions; seek out the impressive historic monuments as well as the new, modern additions. Lausanne Cathedral is believed to be one of Europe's most beautiful Gothic monuments, crowned by spires of unusual purple and orange hues. A brand new Olympic Museum has recently opened in the heart of Lausanne's Old Town; three levels depict Olympic history in all its colourful grandeur. The placement of this new museum comes as a result of the Olympic Committee Headquarters being in Lausanne. The Olympic Park is adjoined to the museum, and is dotted with artworks, sports sculptures, and well-maintained flowers and trees. Beside the Olympic Park is the promenade at Ouchy Harbour, which, when lit up in the evening, will be one of the highlights of your trip. The promenade takes you from the gardens along to the Haldimand Tower, the Bellerive Swimming Pool, the Chateau d'Ouchy, and the port. Enjoy dinner in this beautiful area before returning to your hotel.

Day two: Lausanne to Zermatt

Today you travel by train from Lausanne to Zermatt. This train journey takes just shy of three hours, passing the 80 hectares of the stunning Lavaux Terraced Vineyards, Montreux and Chillon Castle, Martigny, and pausing at Visp while you change trains. As you enter Zermatt, the area's crowning glory will make itself apparent: the Matterhorn. Around it, over 400km of walking and hiking paths vein the landscape, allowing you to capture stunning panoramas of both Zermatt and the Matterhorn while uncovering more of the Alpine flora and fauna.

Day three: Zermatt

Small railways from Zermatt take you high up into the mountains, reaching 3000m above sea level, and the Glacier Paradise cable car transports you up to Europe's highest viewing platform. To extend both your experience of the railways of Valais and the mountains, take the Gornergratbahn up to the summit of the Gornergrat, from where you can bask in views of 38 mountain peaks. Consider visiting the Hornlihutte, where for decades climbers

have famously stayed as they prepare to climb the Matterhorn, via the Hornli Ridge, the Zmutt Ridge, or the north wall. For something wholly unique, spend an hour or two at the Zermatlantis Matterhorn Museum, a faithfully recreated archaeological site. After a thrilling and busy day exploring this dynamic area, dine in one of Zermatt's abundant gourmet restaurants or back at your chosen hotel.

Day four: Zermatt to Locarno/ Ascona on the Glacier Express and Centovalli Express

You board the Glacier Express at Zermatt and travel through the enchanting village of St Niklaus, punctuated by alpine chalets, rustic houses, and golden and green trees, to Brig. Here you might catch a glance of the 17th century Stockalper Castle, the emblem of Upper Valais and the largest 17th century private building in Switzerland. Change trains for Domodossola, where the Centovalli Express railway begins in earnest. Reputedly one of the most romantic train journeys in Europe, the train will take you through picturesque small villages in both northern Italy and southern Switzerland. The journey will take you through Re, home to the imposing Sanctuary of the Madonna of the Blood, which stands perched on the edge of a sheer cliff, before crossing over the border. Gently sloping valleys are interspersed with narrow gaps, tunnels, and bridges that reach across channels of thrashing white and turquoise water. In Ticino, the Centovalli Express ends in Locarno.

Day five: Locarno/Ascona

Your hotel is located in the peaceful adjacent town: Ascona. Here you can appreciate the Mediterranean feel of this canton, but with the bustle of Locarno at a distance. In Locarno, however, you may wish to visit one of the many 16th and 17th century churches, the 15th century Sanctuary of the Madonna del Sasso, or the Visconti Castle and its permanent exhibition of Roman glass. Should your visit fall on a Thursday, attend the local market to sample a few delicacies and watch the streets really come to life with colour and enthusiasm. Outside Locarno, adventurous quests may attempt to climb the Cadada Cimetta, from which you can see both the highest and lowest points of Switzerland simultaneously: the Valais High Alps and Lake Maggiore. In the evenings, return to Ascona to reclaim your bubble of peace and serenity.

Day six: Locarno to Lucerne on the Gotthard Panorama Express train and boat

You will next embark on a route shaped by the legend of the Swiss National Hero of Liberty: Wilhelm Tell. Begin this journey by catching a train to Bellinzona, home to three of Switzerland's best-preserved Medieval castles, where you may need to change for Fluelen. This train journey weaves its way along the valleys of Ticino, passing the waterfalls of Biasca, the Italianate architecture of Faido, a series of historic isolated chalets, and the town of Airolo. On your way out of Ticino, you will pass through the Gotthard Strassentunnel,

as well as the complex network of rail lines in Goschenen. Navigate the Gotthard Loop Tunnels as you travel through the canton of Uri towards the southernmost point of Lake Lucerne. The railway track follows the course of the Reuss River, across flat, wide valleys as it loses altitude. In Fluelen, disembark the train and make your way to the nearby marina. Board the Gotthard Panorama Express steamboat or salon motorboat as you begin the true exploration of Wilhelm Tell's story. Pass the Rutli Meadows, where Friedrich Schiller's telling of the tale is set, and which was also the site on which a treaty was signed in 1291 between Lake Lucerne's neighbouring cantons. The boat also stops off in Sisikon, home to Tell's Chapel and Tell's Slab, where Wilhelm Tell reputedly jumped from the bailiff's boat and pushed it back into the stormy lake waters in the original story. Disembark from the boat at the lido of the Swiss Museum of Transport in Lucerne where you stay next.

Day seven: Lucerne

An essential visit on any stay in Lucerne is the Chapel Bridge, the city's main landmark and the most photographed monument in Switzerland. Walk along the bridge, taking in the views of the Reuss River, the so-called Water Spike, and the Water Tower. For both historical significance and architectural beauty, visit the 17th century Jesuit Church, which overlooks the water and is topped by two droplet-shaped domes. Above the city is the Musegg Wall, a 14th century structure that once protected the city within. Though the city now sprawls outside of this wall, the nine defensive towers still remain, three of which are open to the public. Enjoy lunch in a pavement café on the Kornmarkt Square, beside the colourful Pfistern Guildhall, the Hirschenplatz Square, or the Weinmarkt Square, where Lucerne swore its federal oath with Schwyz, Uri, and Unterwalden. To see some exemplary Swiss culture, visit the prestigious KKL Luzern gallery, the Rosengart Collection of works by Picasso and Klee, the Wagner Museum in Tribschen, and the Swiss Museum of Transport. Finish your days with a sumptuous dinner back at your hotel, or in one of Lucerne's many gourmet restaurants.

Day eight: Lucerne to Saanenland on the GoldenPass line

The first part of your next journey takes you to Interlaken via the Brunig Pass. Here, you can choose to stop off and spend a few hours enjoying the town's remarkable location before boarding another train to Zweisimmen via the Simmental, where you catch the GoldenPass Line for the remainder of the journey to the Saanenland. The distinctive golden carriages

of the GoldenPass Line take you from Zweisimmen, the gateway of the Saanenland, to Schoenried and Gstaad where you stay next.

Day nine: Saanenland

On the border between the cantons of Bern and Vaud, the Saanenland marks the surreal convergence of five individual valleys. Schoenried itself sits on slightly higher ground than its famous neighbour, Gstaad. The area is known for its delicious Alpine dairy products, which are served in many of the 100 gourmet restaurants that line Gstaad's main promenade in the form of fondue or raclette. The boutique shops and quaint cafes housed inside these iconic chalets are well worth a few hours of your time as they capture a great deal of Swiss authenticity. The Molkerei Gstaad allows visitors to taste a selection of the 3,000 cheeses produced in the Saanenland. We would recommend spending a few hours in the Saanenland joining the dots between the traditional farmhouses that surround the fields outside Gstaad, and perhaps venturing further out on one of the hundreds of Alpine trails and paths. Adventurous visitors will want to take a trip up to Glacier 3000 to take in the views of 24 of the surrounding mountains that measure above 4000m. In the evenings, retire to your hotel in Schoenried or Gstaad for a gourmet dinner and a drink beside the cosy fireplace.

Day nine: Saanenland

Board the GoldenPass Line for the two hour journey from Schoenried to Montreux. After passing through Gstaad, the GoldenPass Line crosses the border into Vaud, stopping

first in Rougemont, and then Chateau-d'Oex. Here the mountainscapes are dotted with quaint chalets, small churches, and petit castles; an image that is very typical of the Pays-d'Enhaut. The villages you will pass next all retain their own individual architectural character, emerging out of plumes of evergreen trees. In Rossiniere and Montbovon, passengers can view the startling translucent turquoise water that runs in rivers crossed by ancient wooden bridges. At Les Avants, the train begins to wind its way down the hillside towards Montreux, where you catch an additional train to Geneva for your return flight. If you intend to travel home by rail, we would highly recommend spending an extra night in Geneva to break up the journey.

Priding itself on its traditional service and style, the Hotel Julen is a dark wood chalet adorned with Swiss red shutters and colourful flowers. Spa facilities, warm lounges, and woodenpanelled rooms keep guests comfortable for their whole stay. The Romantik Hotel Julen sits at the heart of Zermatt.

LUCERNE

Hotel Waldstaetterhof 3 star






MAP OF THE GRAND ROMANTIC SWISS RAIL TOUR

GENERAL INFORMATION

This rail holiday is one of several suggested rail holidays we can offer you exactly as it is but also with any alterations you might want including extra nights in one or more places or adding in extra places. All our tours can be extended so that you can include a longer stay in one mountain or lake resort too, perhaps at the end of the itinerary. Do call to discuss the options with our travel consultants.



OUR TOURS

Our rail tours are for individuals travelling on their own or in their own family group. You do not join a group and you are not escorted.

FLEXIBLE ARRANGEMENTS

Our arrangements are very flexible in that you choose to travel on any day you want, subject to availability of trains and hotels. As mentioned above, additional nights can be added at any point.

FLEX PASS INCLUDED

We include travel to and from your first and last hotel but also a Flex pass is included for the rest of the holiday, depending on its length. For example, on a long stay we would include an 8 day Flex pass. This gives you 8 non-consecutive but selected days of travel within a one-month period.

The pass gives you a choice that includes

- Unlimited travel by rail, road and waterway on your selected days of validity, including most panorama routes and public transport in 75 towns and cities
- Free admission to more than 490 museums on the selected days of validity
- Children under the age of 16 travel free of charge when accompanied by at least one parent holding the Swiss Family Card

If we have included a panoramic route in your holiday, we will automatically include any applicable supplements for that train.

TRAIN TIMES

We have planned our itineraries based on train times that work day by day at the time of planning which can be up to a year before you travel. Usually train times stay more or less the same every day, season by season. The times we have planned will be discussed with you at the time you enquire about the holiday and they are detailed to you in your written holiday quotation. It may be that the timetable changes between the planning of the itinerary and when you come to book but we can always adjust the itinerary to suit the actual train times and any requirements you have for particular times of travel.

FIRST OR SECOND CLASS

We will automatically include travel in second class but lots of our clients do upgrade to first class service. On Eurostar this is called Premier Standard for leisure travellers as it gives you an upgraded on-board service and more spacious seating but without paying for the fully-flexible business tickets. On the TGV trains from France to Switzerland, upgrading to first class gives you more spacious seating with increased legroom. Within Switzerland, first class gives you again more space and more comfortable seats, often with a quieter environment. The price of upgrading varies from route to route but is something that is not always proportionately a lot more on the price of the overall holiday, so well-worth considering.

LUGGAGE TRANSFER SERVICE

Swiss rail operates an efficient transfer service for your luggage. This works in a number of ways:

For travel to Switzerland by air, you can checkin your baggage with any airline, from any airport in the world and it will be forwarded to our destination station in Switzerland from Zurich, Bern or Geneva airports. Simply collect your baggage from the station at your destination.

For departure from Switzerland if flying with Swiss, you can check-in for your flight at the train station the day before you fly (major stations only). You receive your boarding pass and your seat allocation and your baggage will be transported onto the aircraft.

For departure from Switzerland with other

airlines eg British Airways or Easyjet, you can have your baggage transported to the airport train station ie Zurich or Geneva and you collect it from there to take it to check-in as usual. Just allow enough time for the luggage to reach the airport station, so well before you travel. Your station will be able to advise a day or two beforehand.

Within Switzerland you can transfer your luggage from one location to another. The Fast Baggage service is available between 45 destinations. You just have to check-in your luggage before 9am at your departure station and collect it by 6pm on the same day at your destination (or sometimes the following day, depending on the actual destination). The cost of this service is approximately £17 per item. TRANSFERS

Transfers in Paris between stations and from the station to each hotel are not automatically included in the price of the holiday. In Paris most clients choose to take a taxi between the stations rather than go on the Metro but we can arrange a private car with driver to take you in between. This is quite useful if you are a family group that can't fit into one Paris taxi. In Switzerland, depending on the location, hotels sometimes have their own transfer vehicles that they will send to collect you if we advise them in advance (eg in St Moritz and Zermatt this is usual) but elsewhere some hotels are within walking distance and others are a short taxi ride away.



OUR PRICES

The sample prices mentioned in this leaflet are generally a 'from' price based on the cheapest season of travel. However, train fares and hotel rates can change (up and down depending on offers), so we give you an accurate price for your holiday when we provide you with a quotation. We recommend travelling to Switzerland by train from London to Basel, and then on to Lake Lucerne, though return flights from the UK with rail travel in Switzerland can also be arranged. Your destination is Brunnen (or another resort on the lake or Lucerne itself if you prefer) on the banks of Lake Lucerne, facing across to the stunning skyline of the Rutli and Schillerstein mountains. Lucerne itself is one of the most beautiful cities in Switzerland: overlooking the stunning lake, and populated by colourful, quirky townhouses. Historic monuments stand in the lake and river waters, on the green terraces of the mountainsides, and emerge proudly from the city streets. Outside the city, vantage points that grant sweeping panoramas across the water and mountains are waiting to be discovered. Use your Swiss rail pass to travel around the lake to villages and towns such as Sisikon, Fluelen, Weggis, and Schwyz, and to take in the views across the many phenomenal sights of natural beauty, including the alpine meadows at Rutli, and Rigi, the Queen of the Mountains.

DAY-BY-DAY SUMMARY

Day one

Travel from London to Brunnen by rail on your first day; or fly into Zurich and travel the rest of the journey by rail. The Eurostar leaves a little before seven in the morning for Paris, where you change to a TGV train headed to Basel. Here, change for a train south-east to Lake Lucerne, arriving in the early evening. It is possible to take the train to Lucerne and make the last stretch of the journey by boat across the lake although this is slower. Check into your chosen resort hotel.

- Wilhelm Tell Express steamboat or salon motorboat – departing from the Swiss Transport Museum in Lucerne, this boat takes you to the most important points in the the legendary story of the Swiss National



LUGGAGE TRANSFER SERVICE

Swiss rail operates an efficient transfer service for your luggage. This works in a number of ways:

For travel to Switzerland by air, you can checkin your baggage with any airline, from any airport in the world and it will be forwarded to our destination station in Switzerland from Zurich, Bern or Geneva airports. Simply collect your baggage from the station at your destination.

Swiss, you can check-in for your flight at the train station the day before you fly (major stations only). You receive your boarding pass and your seat allocation and your baggage will be transported onto the aircraft.

airlines eg British Airways or Easyjet, you can have your baggage transported to the airport train station ie Zurich or Geneva and you collect it from there to take it to check-in as usual. Just allow enough time for the luggage to reach the airport station, so well before you travel. Your station will be able to advise a day or two beforehand.

Within Switzerland you can transfer your luggage from one location to another. The Fast Baggage service is available between 45 destinations. You just have to check-in your luggage before 9am at your departure station and collect it by 6pm on the same day at your destination (or sometimes the following day, depending on the actual destination). The cost of this service is approximately £17 per item.

TRANSFERS

Transfers in Paris between stations and from the station to each hotel are not automatically included in the price of the holiday. In Paris most clients choose to take a taxi between the stations rather than go on the Metro but we can arrange a private car with driver to take you in between. This is quite useful if you are a family group that can't fit into one Paris taxi. 

On Eurostar this is called Premier Standard for leisure travellers as it gives you an upgraded on-board service and more spacious seating but without paying for the fully-flexible business tickets. 




MAP OF BY RAIL TO THE BERNESE OBERLAND HOLIDAY



- Zuoz comprised of typically Engadine houses with sgraffito designs, with a very historic central square; the key to the town's prison tower can be borrowed from the tourist office
- Mustair home of the 8th century Abbey of St John the Baptist, which holds unique Carolingian paintings
- Guarda very well preserved village with narrow cobbled streets, sgraffito houses, and fantastic views
- Tarasp Castle on the way to Scuol; it rises majestically on top of a rocky bluff in the very middle of a verdant valley.
- Bernina Express take a trip on the iconic



Bernina Express, travelling north to Davos and Chur, Switzerland's oldest city, or south across the Italian border to the secluded small town of Tirano

- Swiss National Park 169sqkm of spectacular mountain and wooded scenery; perfect for observing animals and birdlife, including Ibexes and Marmots; visitors must stick to the paths at all times; the village of Zernez is know as the 'Gateway to the Swiss National Park,' and so makes an excellent starting point
- Staz forest romantic carriage rides take you through the forest and around the town

KEMPINSKI GRAND HOTEL DES BAINS

5 star

The luxurious five star Kempinski Grand Hotel des Bains was the first hotel to be built in St. Moritz. It was constructed in 1864 at the source of the Mauritius springs, used since Mediaeval times for their therapeutic benefits and which inspired the early development of this now famous spa resort. Offering traditional elegance in a breath-taking Alpine location, the hotel is spectacular and exhibits exquisite attention to detail in every aspect of its Italian palazzo-style design. 



This town is unendingly popular during the winter for ski holidays, though sits so close to the Italian border that during the summer it makes the perfect sunny hiking destination. - Lac de Moiry contained by the Barrage de Moiry, the waters of this lake are incredibly blue
- Glacier Paradise Cable Car takes you up to Europe's highest viewing platform
- Hornlihutte the restaurant and inn where climbers have stayed for decades before advancing up the Matterhorn
- Alpine Folklore Parade held on 15th August each year, and involving over 1200 participants

- Ice Pavilion, Saas Fee an underground museum that informs visitors of the importance of glaciers and how they are formed; above ground is a revolving restaurant
- Aletsch Glacier a river of ice; the longest glacier in the Alps, and reaching from the Jungfrau to the Rhone River; to the south is the Aletschwald, one of the highest pine forests in Europe and an excellent location for summer hikes
- Riederalp home to an Alpine dairy and an Alpine museum
- Brig further north in Valais is the city of Brig, home to the 17th century Stockalper Castle, built out of granite and volcanic rock and recognisable for its onion domes; it is the emblem of Valais
- Brigerbad this town has the most open-air thermal baths in Switzerland, suited to those seeking the curative properties as well as more leisurely visitors
- Leukerbad home to the hottest springs in Switzerland, Leukerbad was once a Roman settlement
- Mauvoisin Dam a stunning piece of engineering, the dam is wedged in the narrow Bagnes Valley, and holds back 180 million cubic metres of water; public transport to this area is infrequent, so the trip requires a long hike
- Sierre home to many beautiful Chateaux and surrounded by vineyards; the Chateau de Villa holds a wine museum

Balcony rooms offer phenomenal views across Zermatt, wooded areas, and the jagged mountains beyond. This hotel works well as a one- or two-night stop-over on a longer rail touring holiday.



4 star

A traditional wooden building, with a homely, welcoming ambience, the four star Romantik Hotel Julen captures the best of Swiss hospitality near the centre of Zermatt. This family-run business still carries the ethics and values of its founder, Meinrad Julen, who put the wellbeing and comfort of his guests at the forefront of his ambition. The dark wood panelled facade, complete with red shutters and colourful window boxes, introduces you to the traditional style of the interior, inspired by the 'Tradition Julen' that the owners pride themselves on. The rooms have a distinct chalet feel, with wooden walls and ceilings, colourful carpets, and rich textures and fabrics. Warm, golden lighting illuminates the space around the beds, and wide windows offer views across the mountains and icy peaks in the distance. Higher room categories

have more individual details, such as wrought iron candle holders and emerald tiled chimney breasts. The Julen Spa provides guests with a sanctuary in which to unwind after a day hiking across the mountains or exploring the pretty streets of Zermatt. A pool, equipped with waterfall and bubble bench is refreshing after a spell in the Finnish dry sauna. A caldarium relaxes muscles with its hot, bubbling water, and a laconium offers a cooler alternative to the sauna. On the walls, scenes of the ancient Egyptian landscape have been painted to contrast the turquoise tranquillity of the pool. Guests can also enjoy the atmospheric spa at the Hotel Alpenhof, which has additional Kneipp basins. Restaurant Julen, on the ground floor of the hotel, proves continually popular with local residents, serving snacks and light lunches until 2pm, and gourmet cuisine in the evenings. We would recommend reserving a table to ensure you are able to dine here during your stay. The decoration of the restaurant reflects the homely, friendly atmosphere of the hotel, with embroidered cushions, characterful details, and rustic

wooden tables. Guests are also free to use any of the restaurants and bars at the Julen family's other Zermatt hotels: the Hotel Alpenhof, and the Hotel Daniela. The brand new Papperla Pub, just across the road from Hotel Julen, for example, is the perfect place to spend the evenings, with live music, international guests, and a lively atmosphere. The Romantik Hotel Julen offers an authentic and memorable taste of traditional Swiss lifestyle, with many quirky characteristics and a very welcoming vibe.

In the two hotel bars, guests can choose between old-world Swiss style and bright modern interior design while they enjoy a specially crafted cocktail or a glass of wine from the vineyards of Valais' southern border. The guestrooms have the kind of individual detail and luxurious comfort that is associated with five star hotels, as each one seems to have been taken from a regal Swiss stately home. Warm-hued wooden furnishings are accompanied by neutral bed covers, bold golden cushions, rich fabric curtains, and subtle, homely ornamentation. Large windows look out onto wrought iron French balconies decorated with pink flowers. The overall effect is one of warmth, comfort, and light. There is space enough here to spend a few hours enjoying peaceful, private relaxation


