On this wildlife tour, experience the wealth of nature that Sri Lanka has to offer and go in search of its Big Five – the blue whale, sperm whale, Asian elephant, leopard and sloth bear. Please note that this is a seasonal tour running throughout the whale-watching season from December to April.

This holiday can be undertaken staying in a range of hotels. To make things simple initially we have outlined a Luxury option and a Value option. Each combination is based on tried and tested hotels within given price ranges but any other hotels we feature in the respective regions can be included instead, and Luxury and Value hotels can be mixed.

ABOUT THIS TOUR

This tour takes you first from London to Bandaranaike International Airport. From here, your personal chauffeur will take you down to your choice of Colombo hotel for your first night. In the morning of your second day, continue south to Galle and spend a few hours enjoying the history of the old Dutch fort. Then, head along the south coast to Weligama, where you will stay for three nights. Here, you can enjoy the seafront and try some scuba-diving. On Day Five, travel to the edge of the Yala National Park and spend three nights at your chosen Yala hotel. This is the perfect opportunity to witness the famous Sri Lankan leopard in its natural habitat. On Day Head, head back towards Galle and spend one night at the Frangipani Tree in Thalpe, before travelling north to Negombo for your final night. On your last day, enjoy a morning in the city, and then take the short journey from Jetwing Beach to the airport.

DAY-BY-DAY ITINERARY

Colombo - Weligama - Yala - Thalpe - Negombo



Day one: Arrive in Colombo

You will be met on arrival and driven by your English-speaking chauffeur guide who will accompany you throughout your tour of Sri Lanka. You will be driven to your hotel in in Colombo, approximately 1.5 hours' away.

Day two: Colombo to Weligama Bay

After breakfast, head south along the coast road to Galle (approximately 3 hours). Take a walk around the Dutch Fort (UNESCO world heritage site) with its myriad narrow streets within the city walls. Then continue to on Weligama Bay, a small fishing town with a beautiful bay. Weligama Bay stretches all the way from Weligama to Mirissa, and is blessed with incredibly soft, sandy beaches. There are both good waves for surfing and more sheltered waters for snorkelling, and scuba divers can even discover some old shipwrecks offshore. The nearby Dondra lighthouse is Sri Lanka's most southerly point. You will be driven to your hotel for a three night stay.

Days three and four: Weligama Bay

In the mornings, drive with your naturalist to Mirissa and embark on a sea journey in a spacious and comfortable boat. Mirissa is the main point for deep sea fishing and whale watching trips between December and April. Look out for blue whales, spinner dolphins and sperm whales! In the afternoons, relax by the beach or enjoy a dip in the swimming pool.

Day five: Weligama Bay to Yala National Park

After breakfast, head eastwards to the Jetwing Yala or stay in a luxury tented camp as an alternative for three nights (approximately 3.5 hours). This nature resort is located in ten acres of jungle bordering the entrance of Yala National Park and the Indian Ocean. Yala National Park covers an area of 965 sq kilometres and was declared a Game Park in 1938. According to research the park has one of the highest densities of leopards in the world and therefore offers one of the best chances throughout Asia to see these animals. You may also see elephant, sloth bear, sambhur, spotted deer, wild boar, stipenecked, brown and ruddy mongooses, black-naped hare and several species of civet. In the water holes you may see mugger crocodile, painted stork, lesser whistling teal, black-headed lbis, Eurasian spoonbill, egrets and the rare Blacknecked stork.

Days six and seven: Yala National Park

Enjoy morning and afternoon jeep safaris in Yala National Park. You will see that Sri Lanka is blessed to have the opportunity to showcase a huge amount of fascinating wildlife, all of which you will experience during your safaris. Because of the high density of leopards in Yala, the lack of other carnivores means that the leopard is the top predator, so adults and cubs can be remarkably relaxed during the day. Young males in particular seem to have no fear of the jeep which can lead to some excellent photographic opportunities. Yala is also the best place in Asia for sighting the shy and usually nocturnal sloth bear. It is usually cooler in the early mornings and late afternoons, just in time for your safaris!

Day eigth: Yala to Thalpe

After breakfast, leave to travel along the coast to Thalpe (approximately 4 to 5 hours) for one night at the Frangipani Tree on a divine secluded stretch of sandy beach. Just 8km from Galle Fort, Thalpe is blessed with a long stretch of palm fringed golden sand and in season, sea turtles return to the beach here to lay their eggs. The coast is lined with many boutique hotels, created under the influence of Geoffrey Bawa. Geoffrey Bawa is a world renowned architect, often referred to as the father of contemporary Sri Lankan architecture, so it is not uncommon to see villas and hotels in this style.

Day nine: Thalpe to Negombo

Depart for Negombo (approximately 4 hours drive) for a relaxing afternoon and evening at your hotel. Negombo is actually an important fishing town with Portuguese and Dutch colonial heritage. The Dutch legacy is seen in the remains of the grand Dutch Fort and the Dutch canal (now called Hamilton Canal) which runs from Colombo to Chilaw via Negombo. The canal is being revived and you can see galley-painted boats using it as a waterway. The beaches at Negombo are wide and good for beach walking. It is fascinating to see how the fishing industry dominates life in coastal Negombo - the fish market, the auctions, the stalls along the beach. As a tourist resort, Negombo caters to a wide spectrum of holidaymakers on a range of budgets. It's lively at night and has tourist shops and restaurants.

Day ten: Departure from Colombo

Transfer to the airport for your departure (approximately 20 minutes drive).

OPTIONAL

It is possible to add extra nights in the any of the destinations featured in your itinerary, as well as those further north, including Tea Country and the Cultural Triangle.

COLOMBO

The Regency at the Galle Face Hotel

The Galle Face Hotel. Sri Lanka's first purpose-built hotel, dates back to 1864 and has been owned and run by the Gardiner family (father and now son) for over 60 years. A little museum by the tea room houses hotel memorabilia including a vintage car once owned by Prince Philip. Its position facing the Indian Ocean on one side and Galle Face Green park on another gives this magnificent colonial hotel an airy, resort feel although it is right in the centre of Colombo. The Galle Face hotel continues to feature prominently in Colombo life and is still one of the hotspots for socialising and eating. A high tea on the verandah or cocktails on the chess-board terrace at sunset are on the 'must-do' list for any first-timer to Colombo. There are nine places to eat, including a tea room, seafood restaurant and a pub. The seawater swimming pool and the Regency Spa are ideal for relaxing after sightseeing and shopping in the humid city air. The south wing of the Galle Face hotel was painstakingly restored between 2002 and 2004 and opened as The Regency at the Galle Face Hotel, adding 80 luxurious bedrooms and a Spa to this pillar of Sri Lankan hospitality. The bedrooms in The Regency are luxuriously fitted with elegant furniture, marble bathrooms, air-conditioning and modern amenities, whilst still retaining original features such as polished wooden floors, high ceilings and whitewashed walls. The Oceanic suites look directly onto the sea. read more

WELIGAMA BAY

Cape Weligama Resort

Hugging the rugged coastline on Sri Lanka's southern coast, Cape Weligama offers 40 freestanding villas and suites amid a glorious clifftop setting to the west of Weligama Bay. Only 30 minutes' drive from the cultural centre of Galle, the resort is reminiscent of a traditional Sri Lankan village, where terracotta-roofed villas are spread over 12 acres of landscaped gardens. At the eastern and western fringes of the resort's grounds, guests have direct access to two beaches – one a popular swimming beach protected by reef, the other a

quieter spot for secluded paddles. Snorkelling and diving opportunities are great here, with a PADI diving centre offering qualified tuition. For the resort's most spectacular views, the rust-red cliffs are topped with Cape Weligama's one-of-a-kind crescent-shaped infinity pool, the Moon Pool, which is served by the pool bar for daytime relaxation. Smaller infinity pools are deposited evenly among the villas and suites for added privacy. Individually named after famous Ceylon explorers and writers, the accommodation types are divided by size into Wattas and Walauwas. The latter are the resort's most indulgent offering; their name means 'mansion' and they are organised around a children's fun pool to the east of the grounds. Each villa is generous in size and decorated in a style that prioritises comfort, while indulgent additions include a private butler service, bespoke dining and spa facilities. The in-room spa service includes massages on the veranda, bath rituals and steam baths. There are three restaurants at Cape Weligama for those who prefer to dine among company, including the Dining Pavilion's Pola, a seafood market, and the

Japanese offering of Misaki. Cape Weligama is a superb option for indulgent villa-only luxury in close proximity to Weligama and the attractions of Galle in southern Sri Lanka. *read more*

YALA NATIONAL PARK

Noel Rodrigo's Leopard Safaris

With two campsites in Sri Lanka, one in Wilpattu National Park and one in Yala, Noel Rodrigo's Leopard Safaris offers guests the choice between the well-trodden plains of Yala and the lesser-visited park of Wilpattu. Each camp is comprised of semi-permanent tents, each with a great sense of privacy and the welcome additions of modern amenities and electricity. These campsites are recommended for those looking to enjoy the 'wild' setting of a traditional safari, but with the comforts of excellent accommodation. Sturdy four-poster beds, curtained windows, classic en-suites, and peaceful verandas act as attractive finishing touches. Sheltered sitting areas provide respite at the end of a day's game drives, and flavoursome Sri Lankan cuisine is served around the camp table,

creating a vibrant feeling of community. Other activities at the campsites include star-gazing and a photography class, and guided nature walks, and visits to nearby temples can also be arranged. To complete your stay in Yala or Wilpattu, enjoy a refreshing drink around the campfire, or relax with a book in one of the hammocks.

KOGGALA

TR

TRI, built around an ancient Banyan tree on a promontory in Lake Koggala, treats its guests to a truly unique experience of both the natural world of Sri Lanka and luxury accommodation. Arriving guests are taken over to the hotel by boat, which immediately creates a lasting impression of exclusivity and peaceful seclusion. TRI is Sri Lanka's first hotel to seamlessly combine contemporary, cutting-edge design (inspired by the Fibonacci sequence), with total sustainability. Living walls, recycled wood, green roofs, solarheated water, and locally-sourced materials not only help the ten rooms blend in with their lush lakeside position, but also maintain all aspects of the local natural harmony. Guests can experience full immersion into Sri Lankan culture with yoga classes, the Ayurveda spa, and a range of other holistic treatments. Rooms at TRI are split-level, with the bed raised up, which gives a greater sense of space and enhances the spectacular views that can be appreciated from the beds. Glass walls are combined with opaque dividers to create a balance between essential privacy and stunning tropical panoramas. As a result, the view from your room will appear to be entirely yours. A further three rooms are housed inside the unique central Water Tower, which has cinnamon wood walls and is surrounded by a spiral-shaped pool. In addition to the main 21m infinity swimming pool, the infinity pools on the terraces of the larger rooms become surreally sublime due to their lagoon-side, treetop position; and, the high-altitude yoga Shala is suspended above a bamboo grove, and enhances the feeling of natural wellbeing. Here, guests can enjoy classes taught by one of TRI's owners,

a professional yoga teacher. Healthy, delicious food is served in the restaurant, overlooking the treetops below and the banks of the lake. The immersive experience continues in the lake kayaking facilities, temple visit excursions, and private beach club on Kabalana Beach. Those staying for longer may want to embark on a whale-watching trip. *read more*

NEGOMBO

Jetwing Beach

Nestling between palm trees along a charming stretch of beach on Sri Lanka's west coast, Jetwing Beach was the first hotel in Negombo to become a member of Small Luxury Hotels of the World. The cool, contemporary architecture of Jetwing Beach complements the natural environment whilst allowing guests to relax in luxury, with minimalist interiors in the bedrooms and suites creating bright and unfussy surroundings. Originally designed by Geoffrey Bawa, the Jetwing Beach was renovated entirely in 2004. Large glass doors open onto a private balcony or terrace that overlooks the sea, an attractive feature of

each room, and the suites benefit from butler service. Set in lush tropical gardens, Jetwing Beach hotel also has tennis courts and an outdoor swimming pool. A professional water sports centre, scuba diving and windsurfing are available nearby and safaris and game drives can be organised on request. The spa at Jetwing Beach has two treatment rooms and a steam room, and there is an Ayurvedic centre with a selection of traditional treatment programmes at its sister hotel, Ayurveda Pavilions. International and local cuisine is served in the Sands Restaurant, which is open 24 hours and is partly open air. Alternatively, the fine dining restaurant, Black Coral, is open in the evenings. After dinner, relax with a cocktail or a glass of wine at the Terrace Bar, overlooking the hotel's grounds. Jetwing Beach is in an excellent location for exploring the surrounding area: the fishing town of Negombo with its churches, temples and mosques, Dutch fort and colourful local shops, the nearby Murhurajawala marshlands and the Dutch Canal. read more

COLOMBO

Mount Lavinia Hotel

The Mount Lavinia Hotel has a rich 200-year heritage as a British Governor's residence and fashionable beach resort. This impressive white colonial hotel stands on a rocky promontory overlooking the bay of Galkissa, 12 kilometres south of Central Colombo. The Mount Lavinia Hotel enjoys extensive beach frontage and has a vast terrace with a large swimming pool and terrace bar affording panoramic views of the Colombo skyline and the Indian Ocean. Its 275 bedrooms range from standard category to Suite, all with private balcony and sea view. There is a seafood restaurant by the beach and other speciality restaurants serving succulent dishes cooked by celebrated chefs. Other facilities include the Coconut Spa, a business centre, shopping arcade and beach volleyball.

Weligama Bay Resort is set on a sandy beach in the middle of Weligama Bay on Sri Lanka's quieter, stunning southern coast. The 24 individually designed bedrooms of this newly-built boutique hotel are housed in a main building and a collection of garden villas and joined bungalows. Set around a tropical garden and swimming pool, the accommodation at Weligama Bay Resort offers up-to-date technical equipment and individual air-conditioning, not to mention breathtaking views over the Indian Ocean. The stylish furniture is made from teak wood and comfortable bathrooms are made from white terrazzo. In the Bawana Spa. vou will find traditional Ayurveda treatments as well as relaxing aromatherapy, Shirodara and exquisite elixirs of oils, fresh tropical fruits and spices to pamper your skin. Weligama Bay Resort's air-conditioned Cutty Sark restaurant and the open-air terrace bar invite you to explore Sri Lankan and international cuisine right by the beach, listening to the crashing waves as you relish grilled lobster and traditional watalapan. The advantageous position of Weligama Bay Resort on this beautiful bay in Southern Sri Lanka makes it an excellent location for sea

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THALPE

The Frangipani Tree

On a secluded stretch of sandy beach at Thalpe, just minutes from historic Galle, lies the Frangipani Tree, a collection of exquisitely furnished suite-villas named after the turtles that inhabit these shores. Set in a palmfringed garden with 35-metre lap pool, tennis court and beach spa, and offering a gourmet kitchen service and a discreet team of staff, the Frangipani Tree is really more of a small boutique hotel than villa accommodation. The nine bedroom suites are housed in three elegant villas - Olive Ridley (5 bedrooms), Leatherback (2 bedrooms) and Hawksbill (2 bedrooms) - they are offered as individual one-bedroom suites, although it is possible to book a whole villa. Each suite has an elegant four-poster bed, a private dining table, a contemporary bathroom and stunning ocean views. Bawa-style open-air bathrooms in most of the bedrooms and shady verandah and terraces give the accommodation an airy and elegant feel. The chefs can prepare fresh daily menus for breakfast, lunch and dinner according to your tastes and the availability of produce - local fresh seafood, Sri Lankan and Mediterranean are their specialities. Up to 20 people can be seated on a splendid dining table on the Frangipani Tree terrace, ideal for parties staying in different suites.

Sociable sorts can wallow on designer sofas in the Frangipani Tree lounge, watching a movie or regaling travellers tales. The Frangipani Tree is a wonderful place for relaxing and wandering along the beach, looking for turtles and fishermen on stilts. In season, sea turtles return to the beach here to lay their eggs. read more



GENERAL INFORMATION

This touring holiday is one of several suggested holidays we can offer you exactly as it is but also with any alterations you might want, including extra nights in one or more places or adding in extra places. All our tours can be extended so that you can include a longer stay in one location too, perhaps at the end of the itinerary. Do call to discuss the options with our travel consultants.



OUR TOURS

Our touring holidays are for individuals travelling on their own or in their own family group. You do not join a group, but are escourted by your own private English-speaking chauffeur-guide.

FLEXIBLE ARRANGEMENTS

Our arrangements are very flexible in that you choose to travel on any day you want, subject to availability of flights and hotels. As mentioned above, additional nights can be added at any point.

FLIGHT ARRANGEMENTS

Sri Lankan Airways operates daily flights to Colombo from London Heathrow. Most flights leave London in the afternoon or evening. Flight time is about 11 hours. There is economy and a business class cabin. In recent years, the business class cabins have been upgraded to fully reclining flat-beds. From Colombo you can also take the Sri Lankan air taxi to regional centres throughout the country. Sri Lankan Airways also operates flights to the Maldives via Colombo, making Sri Lanka and the Maldives a perfect two-centre combination.

TRAVEL WITHIN SRI LANKA

We include private transfers with all our holidays to Sri Lanka, and a personal chauffer with all our touring holidays. Your English-speaking chauffeur-guide will meet you on arrival at Colombo airport, then accompany you on your journey around the island. All our holidays are for individuals, so you travel as your own party and do not join a group. It is also possible to hire a car in Sri Lanka, which can be arranged locally or in advance. A more popular option is to hire a car with driver for day trips or excursions, which, again, can be arranged by us in advance or by the hotel locally.

TOURING HOLIDAYS

A touring holiday of Sri Lanka is at the heart of what many of our clients want to experience from this fascinating country, and it is where we excel at using our personal knowledge and experience to tailor a holiday that is a perfect match for you. Stay in several different locations around Sri Lanka, allowing time to explore and relax in each. Combine a few nights on the beach with stays in the Kandy Hills, in the Cultural Triangle, on a high tea estate or in a national wildlife park, in Galle, Negombo, or Colombo. It makes sense to factor in a night or two in Colombo, Negombo, Wadduwa, or at the Wallawwa near the airport, at the beginning and/or end of your holiday to coincide with flight times.

REGIONS OF SRI LANKA

Roughly only half the size of England, yet packed with a whole continent's worth of temples, ruins, wildlife reserves, and luxury beach resorts, Sri Lanka is a beautiful, bitesized slice of paradise offering a whole world of diverse escapes. Littered with elegant colonial hotels and enchanting boutique lodges, Sri Lanka also offers luxury at a relative snip. Young or old, family or couple, beach-bound or culture-vulture - a visit to Sri Lanka satisfies everyone. Formerly an Arab trading port, the commercial capital Colombo is a bustling, colourful town, with a fabulous bazaar, colonial churches, and craft markets. To the north of Colombo lies Negombo and the beaches of the west coast, whilst to the south Wadduwa is the start of a string of fabulous beaches running all the way down and around Sri Lanka's southwest coast, with a collection of intimate, exquisite beach resorts. Further southward lies historic Galle, a reminder of the Dutch presence on the island. Inviting as Sri Lanka's coastline is, however, the island's interior is worth the airfare alone, with forest parks sheltering leopards and wild Asian elephants, a verdant hill country carpeted in tea plantations with lovely boutique planter's house hotels, and no visitor to Sri Lanka should be allowed to miss the Cultural Triangle, boasting five UNESCO World Heritage Sites in an area no bigger than Kent. New to tourism is the north and north east of Sri Lanka, strewn with Hindu temples, colonial gems and long white beaches offering spectacular snorkelling.

THINGS TO SEE IN SRI LANKA

Cricket is a national sport, played on every dusty maidan and patch of grass from Jaffna to Galle. A real highlight of any trip to the south is Galle Fort, where you can wander round the ancient ramparts at sunset, watching cricket games below, or stroll along the narrow streets in search of antiques in tiny, friendly shops. Local festivals such as Vesak full moon in May and Poson full moon in July, as well as the famous Esala Festival in Kandy in July and August, when Buddha's tooth is taken out from the temple and paraded through the streets. Visiting national parks, sheltering an abundance of wildlife including leopards, elephants, bears and hundreds of species of birds. Buying tea, gems, jewellery, spices for a local bazaar. Fantastic spicy local cuisine, specialising in fish dishes, and delicious 'egg hoppers.' Tea-tasting in the hill country. Sigirya Rock Fortress. The Cave temples of Dambulla. The medieval capital and ruins of Polonnaruwa. The sacred city of Anuradhapura. The west coast beaches flanked by palm trees, including Negombo, Beruwela, Bentota and Galle. The elephant orphanage at Pinnawela. The tea plantations near Nuwara Eilya, a region known locally as Little England. Ayurvedic massage. A warm welcome wherever you go.
